# **Sweepings 2012**

## **Activity and Service Fee Sweepings**

### **Proviso Language**

### **Special Instructions**

## **I. General**

- A. No A&S funded account may pay any stipend, wage, salary, or salary increase to any positions not funded in Sweepings 2012 without express consent of the Student Senate.
- B. In the event of shortfalls or excesses, the Vice President of Student Affairs, the SGA Advisor, the Senate President, and the Student Body President shall meet to review options.

## **II. CAMPUS RECREATION**

- A. Money allocated to Campus Recreation shall be spent on the following four items: Minimum Wage Increase (\$8,000), Complimentary Towel Service Trial (\$11,780), Leach Personal Training Studio (\$34,900), and Locker Upgrade-Phase II (\$36,450).

## **III. UNIVERSITY UNION**

- A. Any event or entertainment provided by the University Union shall be free and open to all students with valid identification with the exception of Breakfast for a Buck. Non-FSU students shall be subject to admission fees.
- B. Of the money allocated to the Oglesby Union: \$50,000 will be allocated to the upgrading of Bathrooms in the Union, \$5,000 will be allocated for the Askew Life Cinema to offset increases in film title rental rates and shipping costs, \$13,000 will be allocated for the Flying High Circus to fund a sound system upgrade.

## **IV. STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION**

- A. Money allocated to SGA Executive Projects shall be spent: Safe Bus Connect (\$3,000), FSU PD (\$2000), Mobile Night Time Transportation App (\$5000), Dirac Renovations (\$10,000).
- B. The Office of Governmental Affairs must fill 2 of the 6 spots available for the trip to Washington D.C. by students from a widely publicized application.
- C. Money allocated to the Class Councils shall be spent: DJ for the Junior Class Council's Rip the Office (\$500), Food for the Sophomore Class Council's Outdoor Screen Viewings (\$1,000).

## **V. STUDENT ACTIVITIES AND ORGANIZATIONS**

- A. Agencies, bureaus and affiliated projects are strongly encouraged to utilize the event planning and contract negotiation services offered by the Student Activities Center throughout the planning and execution of any A&S funded events. Events involving a contractual service (speaker, musician, comedian, trainer, performer, etc.) exceeding \$2000 are to be planned and negotiated in consultation with a representative from the Student Activities Center prior to any verbal or written commitment of such A&S funds. This clause shall only pertain to the contractual service (speaker, musician, comedian, trainer, performer, etc.) for negotiation and not necessarily for other arrangements such as space reservations, advertisement or any other component of the program.
- B. Monies in the Food category shall never be used for Executive Board meetings and not more than three times each semester for General Body meetings.
- C. The Black Student Union shall fund \$2,075 from Expense towards the purchase of doors, cable, and a television with wall mount.
- D. Monies given to the Center for Participant Education shall be spent: \$150 towards the purchase of books.
- E. Monies given to the Inter-Residence Hall Council will be allocated with \$2,080 in Clothing/Awards going toward the purchase of 500 Garnett t-shirts, \$3,152 in Expense going toward travel for conferencing trips and advertising materials.

## VI. OTHER DEPARTMENTAL REQUESTS

- A. With funding going toward University Libraries, Reading Writing Center and ACE Tutoring it is the opinion of the committee that OPS should be budgeted for by other University entities.
- B. The Reading and Writing Center allocation will fund \$5,000 in OPS Wages, \$5,450 for Expense for: Furniture (tables and chairs) (\$5,000), Laminator and necessary laminating supplements (\$400), Clock (\$50.00).
- C. The ACE Tutoring allocation will Fund \$2,010 in Expense with \$400 towards the purchase of an industrial coffee pot.
- D. University Libraries Tech Center will allocate \$3,899 in Expense for the purchase of Digital SLR cameras with one being designated for the use of SGA, Bureaus, and Agencies.
- E. Health Services will allocate \$3,400 toward Healthy Noles Cinema, \$5,950 toward National Nutrition Month, \$1,500 for food, \$23,259 toward the Campus Wide Initiative. No A&S fees go towards the purchase of awards.
- F. Career Center will allocate \$5,000 toward Seminole Success Night, \$824 toward the LinkedIn Photo Booth.
- G. Greek Life will allocate \$200.00 of the \$9,200 in Expense for the purchase of advertising and promotional items for the online Tomahawk. It is the opinion of the committee that Greek Life

works towards paperless publishing.

- H. Dean of Students will allocate \$3,529 in OPS Wages towards the Victim Advocate Program.

## **VII. SEVERABILITY CLAUSES**

- A. All clauses in the Proviso Language for Sweepings 2012 shall be considered fully severable.
