Details of event:

As part of FSU Law's Wellness Week, the Office of Student Advancement and the Student Bar Association are putting together a socially distant drive-in movie night on Friday, March 19th, 2021 in the Tucker Center Main Parking lot. The estimated attendance is 100 people. This is not a ticketed event. The goal of the event is to provide a fun activity for students in acknowledgment of the importance of mental health. Wellness week is the Law School's way to help offset the fact students are not getting a spring break this year. In other years, we would not approve a cost this large from an organization for a singular event however this year has been unusual in many senses which leads an event like this to be able to do some good for law school students more broadly. The students would stay in their cars to watch this movie in the Civic Center parking lot. There is not food being provided.

Notes:

The costs of the event include:

- The cost to lease the space (Tucker Center Main Parking Lot) - \$1,500.00.
- Event staff, including the changeover crew, cleaning staff, EMT, Parking Lot Attendant, and Police Officer - \$1,675.65.
 - o This cost is required by the Civic Center
- Portable restrooms on the site and a hand-washing station - \$445
 - o This prevents students from going in and out of the law school or the civic center to use the restroom keeping it as Covid friendly as possible.
- The total cost of the Civic Center is \$3,620
- Production company cost quote to display the movie outside - \$8,669.0.
