Questions:

- What are the funds for?
 - This event will start off with breakfast and a lecture on patient-provider communication, communication etiquette (including person-first vs identity-first language, disability vocabulary, and accessibility). This lecture will be given by a professor from the main campus. This will be followed by a mini-clinical learning session with standardized patients who have disabilities. These standardized patients will also share their medical experiences (the good and the bad) with students and participants.
 - **Note: Approved for a total of \$160 for food purchases**
 - Items from Publix include 2 entertainer platters @ \$40.00 each, 2 baked goods orders @ \$50, and various drinks and bottled water
 - Note: Instructed RSO on adhering to FSU COVID guidelines; RSO will be in charge of handling food and members will wear masks. RSO advised to ensure presenters are comfortable with food being served.
 - Note: Reminded RSO that purchases are exempt from tax.
