ANNABELLE : CREATION & SCREAM

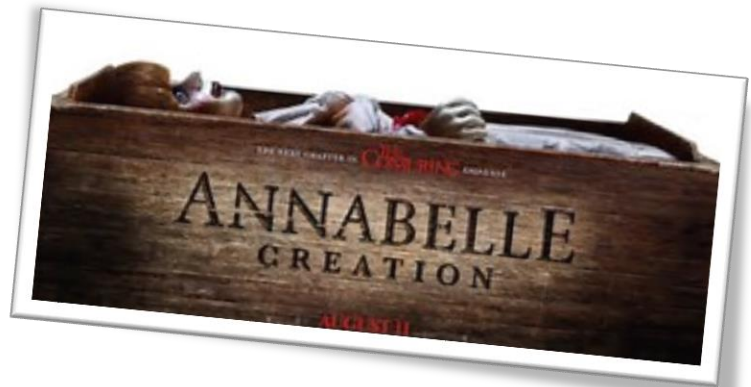
Halloween is nearing, so the Student Life Center is putting on HORROR FEST for the upcoming creepy season !
