Bill 07	Sponsored by Garcia (P) This statute revision creates the Campus Wellness and Security Council, the purpose of which is to address issues related to student safety such as the increase of drink spiking, hazing, sexual assault, and overdoses.
Bill 08	Sponsored by Garcia (P) Ahuja, Anandjwala, Baresi, Castellanos, Carr, Chinn, Daley, Emokidi, Gomez, Gorelick, Hellmann, Hine, McEnery, Meier, Olsen-Galvan, Ramos, Randall, Rodriguez, Smith, Valdes-Herrera, Vargheese, Windlan (Co) This statute revision would add the legislative agenda, received by senators in advance of senate each week, to the list of information required to be published on the SGA website. Additionally, this would make it so that the agenda must be published 24 hours in advance, or in accordance with when it is received by student senators. This would

promote SGA transparency by giving the student body a better idea of which pieces of legislation are being discussed, so they can prepare to speak in testimony or sit in on meetings with bills of importance.

Resolution 12	Sponsored by Goldstein (P) This legislation advocates for Florida State University (FSU) to include Electric Vehicle (EV) charging stations in its Campus Master Plan, in line with the National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure (NEVI) program. It encourages FSU to collaborate with state and regional transportation planning bodies, like the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) and the Capital Region Transportation Planning Agency (CRTPA), for the

deployment of EV charging stations. The resolution also asks for regular updates on these initiatives to be provided to the student body and other stakeholders.
