**BE IT ENACTED BY THE SEVENTY THIRD STUDENT SENATE:**

**A Constitutional Amendment** to increase the Congress of Graduate Students' ability to allocate Activities and Services Fees on behalf of graduate students at Florida State University.

Article IX, Section 2

*Resolved by the Student Senate at Florida State University (with two-thirds concurring therein), that the following article is proposed as an amendment to the Constitution of the Student Body, which shall be valid to all intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when ratified by two-thirds vote of the Student Body electorate, and*

*Further resolved, that the following article be placed on the Ballot of the Election in the Fall Academic term of the year 2021.*

This amendment corrects the registration classifications to be in accordance with current policy and increased the allocation of graduate student Activities and Services fees to fifty percent of their annual yield.

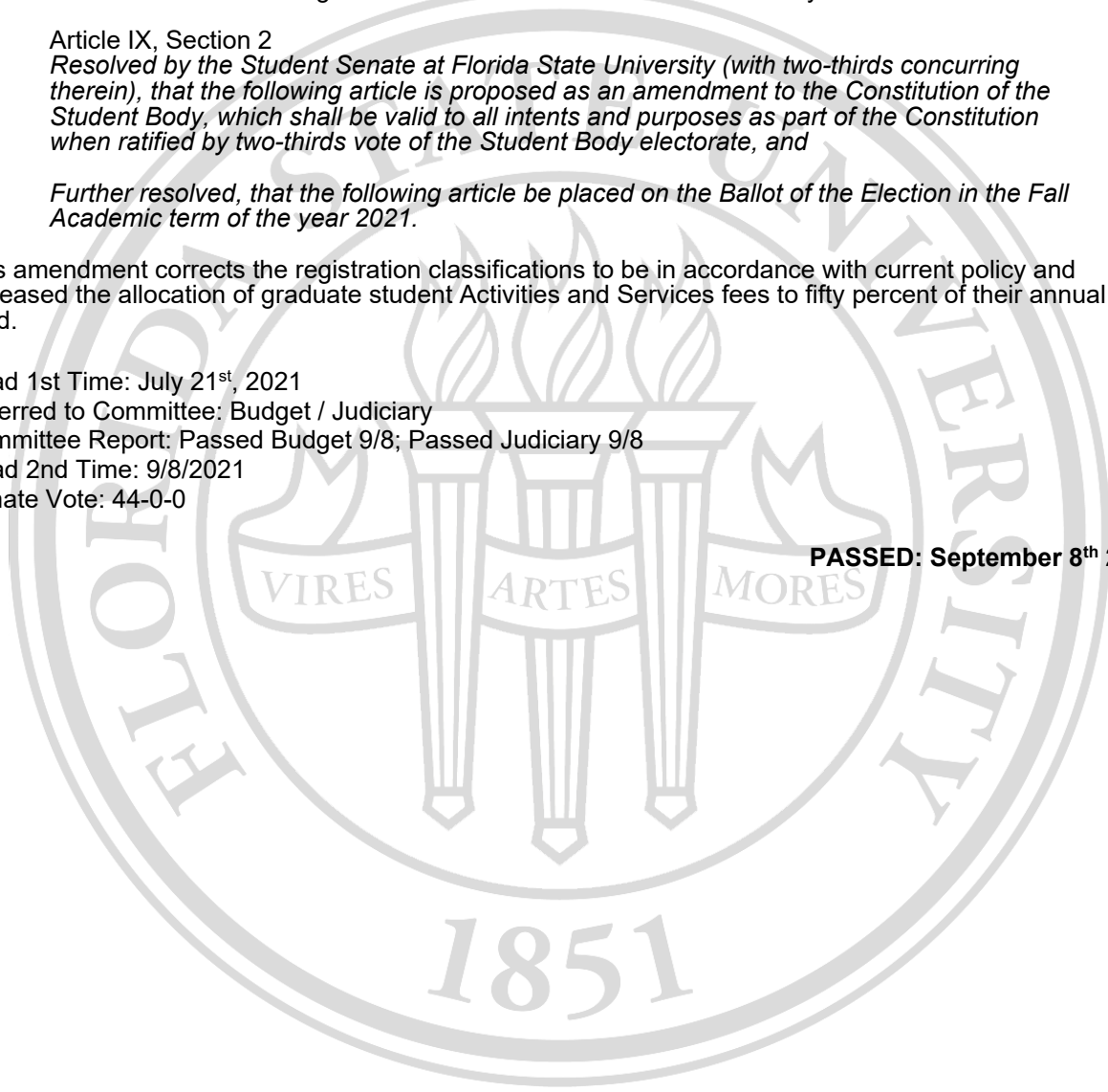

## ARTICLE IX CONGRESS OF GRADUATE STUDENTS

**Section 2** Graduate students shall receive fifty percent (50%) of Activities and Services (A&S) Fees paid by students classified by the Registrar as Master's, Specialist, Doctoral, Juris Doctor, Doctor of Medicine, or otherwise notated as post-baccalaureate and/or graduate students. These fees shall be allocated to COGS by SGA at the start of the annual budget process and shall be administered by the elected representatives in the Congress of Graduate Students. COGS financial administration shall be consistent with and subject to the Student Body Constitution, and Statutes.
