ORDER OF DISMISSAL

Jurisdiction

Pursuant to Section 3(C)(2) and 3(C)(4) of Article IV of the Florida State University Student Body Constitution, this Court shall have jurisdiction over alleged “violations of the Student Body Constitution and Statutes” and the ability to issue writs of mandamus.

Factual and Procedural Background

On February 13, 2018, John Walker (Plaintiff) petitioned this Court to issue a writ of mandamus to compel the Supervisor of Elections to comply with section 714.1(G) of the Florida State University Student Body Statutes.

Plaintiff’s demand stemmed from a prior failure of the Supervisor of Elections to honor Plaintiff’s request to set up a Qualtrics form for students interested in receiving emails from his campaign.

Holding

The issue is now moot as the Supervisor of Elections properly established a Qualtrics form pursuant to Plaintiff’s request.

The Complaint is hereby DIMISSED WITHOUT PREJUDICE.
