Chapter 406 Investigative Rights of the Senate

History: Added by the 45th Senate Bill 49. Revised by the 49th Senate Bill 14. Revised by the 60th Senate Bill 19.

- A. The Student Senate shall have the right to initiate and conduct an investigation in order to examine any impropriety or to question any action of any Student Government Association officer, employee, appointed official, or Student Government Association funded organization agency, bureau, affiliated project, or funding board.
- B. An investigative Board may only be initiated by:
 - 1. A 2/3majority vote by the Student Senate in the form of a resolution, or
 - 2. Whenever a standing or ad hoc committee deems necessary by **2/3majority** vote, or
 - 3. The Student Senate President.
- C. An Investigative Board will consist of the Judiciary Committee unless otherwise deemed by the a Student Senate President-resolution.
- D. All conclusions of any Investigative Board will be reported to the Student Senate in the form of a resolution.
- E. An Investigative Board may make a recommendation for action to the Student Senate <u>in</u> the form of a resolution.
- F. If the Investigative Board produces a resolution containing the results of the investigation or any recommendation for action, upon passage by the senate, the resolution shall be published in the Senate minutes.
- G. Any Investigative Board shall have the right to subpoena any records related to the investigation subject to state and federal law.
 - 1. An investigative board may issue a subpoena by majority vote.
