Resolution #: 37

Primary Sponsor: Jacobsen & Harmon

Whereas: Senate rule 413.8 states "Membership in the Senate Hall of Fame is the highest honor a student Senator can achieve. This honor shall be bestowed upon any Senator who has performed their duty as a member of the Senate with the highest standard of excellence, beyond that normally expected of a Senator at the Florida State University," and

Whereas: Emily Durham has served honorably in the 70th, 71st, and 72nd Student Senate, and

Whereas: Senator Durham has served as Chair of the Internal Affairs Committee in which she oversaw the interview process for numerous candidates for student body offices, and

Whereas: Senator Durham helped overhaul the Bureau Review process by outlining the steps in statutes for future review processes, and

Whereas: Senator Durham created legislation that directly supported the incoming freshman during orientation by funding the New Student and Family Programs red reusable bags, and

Whereas: Senator Durham has served as the Office of Governmental Affairs Liaison acting as the bridge between Senate and OGA, and

Whereas: Senator Durham introduced legislation that created a new Bureau named "Student Council for Accessibility Advocacy (SCAA)" which promotes both physical and mental accessibility measures within the Student Government Association, and

Whereas: Senator Durham has served, in an informal capacity, as a guide and mentor to less experienced members of the senate and the Internal Affairs committee, therefore

Be it resolved by the Seventy-second Student Senate at Florida State University that: Senator Emily Durham be nominated for the Senate Hall of Fame and forwarded to the Senate Hall of Fame Selection Committee.
