## 75<sup>th</sup> STUDENT SENATE Senate Resolution

**Whereas:** The 19th of June is nationally recognized as Juneteenth to commemorate the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in Galveston, Texas in 1865, and

Whereas: the emancipation in Galveston was two years after the Emancipation Proclamation was signed by President Lincoln, prolonging the long-overdue freedoms of Black Americans, and

Whereas: the 19th of June has been celebrated annually by Americans but not federally observed until President Biden signed a bill in 2021, and

Whereas: Juneteenth provides an opportunity for reflection and education on the ongoing legacy of slavery, and

Whereas: the Black Student Union, located at 921 W. Jefferson St., stands to provide an atmosphere of unity on campus and expand opportunities for minorities, and

**Whereas:** as of June 2023, the Florida legislature has passed laws that could jeopardize federal funding for activities that promote diversity, equity, and inclusion, and

**Whereas:** Florida State University values and embraces diversity, promoting an inclusive environment that encourages cultural understanding and appreciation, and

**Whereas:** Florida State University acknowledges Juneteenth as a holiday by closing the university for students and staff, and therefore

Be it resolved by the Seventy-fifth Student Senate at Florida State University that: we recognize and celebrate Juneteenth on June 19th, 2023, and

**Be it further resolved that:** the Student Senate stands in support of Florida State University's black students as well as members of the community across the country who feel the impacts of this wave of legislation, and

**Be it further resolved that:** the Seventy-fifth Student Senate asks the Florida State University community to consider Juneteenth an opportunity to reflect on our nation's history and continue to engage in conversations about how we can work towards a more diverse, inclusive, and equitable community
