Whereas: The Black Lives Matter mural in the intersection of Gaines Street and Railroad Avenue was established on July 8th, 2020, and served as a powerful symbol of unity, justice, and equity, and

Whereas: over time, elements and natural wear have caused the mural to fade and lose its vibrancy, diminishing its impact as a visual representation of solidarity, and

Whereas: The Florida State University Student Senate recognizes the importance of maintaining the visibility and relevance of the Black Lives Matter movement in our community, and

Whereas: a refreshed and well-maintained mural will reaffirm commitment to the principles of justice, equality, and the ongoing fight against systemic racism, and

Whereas: the Student Government Association recognizes the importance of public art in fostering dialogue and raising social awareness. Recognizing this mural's important role in our community, the Student Government Association emphasizes its commitment to reinforcing this meaningful expression of unity.

Be it resolved by the Seventy-Sixth Student Senate at Florida State University that: Florida State University respectfully requests the City of Tallahassee's collaboration and support in allocating the necessary time and resources to repaint the Black Lives Matter Mural on the intersection of Gaines Street and Railroad Avenue, ensuring its continued resonance as a symbol of unity and social progress in our community.
