Senate Resolution 10

Sponsored by Senator Hill

WHEREAS, Goal V of the Florida State University Strategic Plan states, "Preparing our Graduates for 21st Century Careers."

WHEREAS, Clause 1 of Goal V of the Florida State University Strategic Plan states, "Expand experiential, cross-cultural, and collaborative learning." And sub clause 1 states, "Increase opportunities for community service, internships, and paid employment, and connect those experiences to preparation for post-graduate success."

WHEREAS, Many employers seek graduates with experience outside of the traditional classroom setting. This may take the form of internships, externships, or jobs.

WHEREAS, A co-operative education program is a four to five-year, academic pathway designed to complement a student's formal education with paid practical work experience directly related to the student's academic major.

WHEREAS, Florida State University does not currently have a co-operative education program that allows students to receive pay and class credits at the same time.

WHEREAS, Many universities in the United States have co-operative education programs such as but not limited to: Purdue University, Northeastern University, and University of South Florida

WHEREAS, U.S News and World Report has previously ranked institutions of higher education based on their internships and co-operative education programs.

WHEREAS, A co-operative education program would contribute in attaining Goal V of the Florida State University Strategic Plan.

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE SIXTY NINTH STUDENT SENATE and the student body formally request that the university provide a more formal experiential learning opportunity in the form of a co-operative education program.

Senate Resolution 13
Sponsored by: Senator King

- WHEREAS:** In a Campus Climate Survey administered in Spring 2016, 8.8% of surveyed students were victims of sexual violence since Fall 2015, 19.1% were victims of dating violence, and 11.8% were victims of stalking, and
- WHEREAS:** 400 cases were reported by FSU students seeking support from the Victims Advocate Program in 2015, and
- WHEREAS:** FSU received a grant in October of 2015 as part of a strategic plan to empower individuals and organizations in Florida to end sexual violence through social change, advocacy, education, and training, and
- WHEREAS:** The Green Dot strategy is a set of bystander interventions aimed at educating individuals to recognize high risk situations that may result in sexual violence, relationship violence, and stalking and to teach bystanders the skills to assess a situation and intervene in a safe and effective manner, and
- WHEREAS:** During the Fall 2016 semester, 1,300 students were reached by Green Dot through focus groups, trainings, and events, and
- WHEREAS:** There have been six, six-hour training sessions thus far, each including a follow up survey, and
- WHEREAS:** In each of these surveys, 96-100% of students surveyed said they felt prepared to intervene in a situation based on the training received, and
- WHEREAS:** One of the goals of the FSU Strategic Plan for 2017 is to ensure student success on campus and beyond by ensuring that FSU remains

a welcoming and safe campus community that develops the “whole person” and promotes well-being for all students, and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY NINTH STUDENT SENATE AT THE FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY THAT:

Students who receive OPS Wages from the Student Government Association, as well as leaders of the four Greek councils, shall be encouraged to participate in Green Dot training.
