Amending Chapter 400.1 "Senate Session"

First, striking part A

Second, rewriting part A to then say "The fall, spring, and summer meeting for the Student Senate shall begin on the second Wednesday on the respective semester, and shall terminate on the Wednesday prior to finals week of the particular semester."

400.1 Senate Session

Fall, spring, and summer meetings

~~The fall, spring, and summer meetings of the Student Senate shall begin on the second Wednesday of Fall, and the first Wednesday of Spring and Summer classes and shall terminate on the Wednesday prior to finals week of the three semesters.~~

The fall, spring, and summer meetings of the Student Senate shall begin on the second Wednesday in the respective semester, and shall terminate on the Wednesday prior to finals week of that particular semester.

Each Student Senate shall adopt its own Rules of Procedure in accordance with the Student Body Constitution and Statutes.

Except for summer leave of absences, no leave of absence may exceed one week. No Senator may take more than three (3) leaves of absences in one semester. Further, absences accrued during any further leaves shall be considered unexcused absences. Special exceptions may be granted by the

THE SIXTY NINTH STUDENT SENATE

Resolution

Sponsored by: Senator Mix

WHEREAS: In the past 5 years at Florida State University, the amount of freshmen taking 12 credit hours have increased dramatically while the amount of freshmen taking 15 has declined, and

WHEREAS: According to research done by Dr. Burnette, Director of Institutional Research at Florida State University, many other universities are noticing dramatic improvements in student performance when they take 15 hours as opposed to 12; students who take 12 credit hours have the lowest first-year GPA with an average of 2.95 while those who take 14 or more credit hours have an average of a 3.15 and thus are more likely to keep their Bright Futures scholarship, and

WHEREAS: Students who take 15 credit hours or more the Fall of their freshmen year are 25% more likely to graduate on time; students who take 12 credit hours are 12% less likely to graduate in four years while those who took 15 credit hours in the Fall or Spring were 1.5 times more likely to graduate on time; Students who never take a 15 hour load are 3 times more likely to never graduate, and

WHEREAS: Students in the bottom 10% based on tests scores and GPA who took 15 credit hours graduate sooner than those in the top 10% who take 12 hours; in addition, students who take 15 credit hours have more time to begin graduate level coursework or have a semester long internship; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY NINTH STUDENT SENATE AT THE FLORIDA STATE UNIVERSITY THAT:

The Student Government Association strongly supports the Take 15 initiative and highly encourages all students to take 15 credit hours because of the many benefits listed above.
