Sponsored by Senator Barth

**WHEREAS:** Graduate assistants represent the single largest working group at the Florida State University, and provide the majority of instruction and contribute to nearly all of the research which make this a preeminent institution, and

**WHEREAS:** Every graduate assistant is a graduate student, and

**WHEREAS:** Stipends for these employees are far below national averages, and in some cases are as low as \$4400 for nine months, and

**WHEREAS:** Every graduate student must pay additional fees each semester, which range from \$700 to \$900, and

**WHEREAS:** On July 22, 2014, the Florida State University Board of Trustees proposed the following terms be added to Article 7, "Outside Activity/Conflict of Interest," of The Collective Bargaining Agreement:

7. 2 A "Outside employment or activity is defined as private practice, private consulting, additional teaching or research, or other professional activity, compensated or uncompensated, which is not part an employee's assigned University duties, conducted by the employee outside of his/her University appointment with a non-University entity or entities."

**WHEREAS:** The proposal additionally adds that:

7. 3 "An individual program is entitled to prohibit outside employment or activity and/or prohibit or place limitations on additional employment..."

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY-SIXTH STUDENT SENATE THAT:** We support the efforts of the United Faculty of Florida – Florida State University – Graduate Assistants United to nullify these proposed restrictions on the outside employment and activities of graduate assistants.
