Chapter 415 Senate Legislative Aide Act

415.1 Indication of Interest

<u>Prospective legislative aides may express their interest by completing an interest survey created by the Senate Pro Tempore located on the Student Government Association website.</u>

- A. This Survey shall be advertised within two weeks of spring and fall inauguration.
- B. Senators shall be notified weekly of prospective legislative aides.

415.2 Roles and Responsibilities

A. Responsibilities of Legislative Aides

- 1. Legislative Aides shall attend all senate and committee meetings with their Senator.
- 2. <u>Legislative Aides shall assist their Senator in drafting legislation and developing opinions</u> on senate legislation.
- 3. Legislative Aides shall complete a Legislative Aide Report following each Senate.
- 4. <u>Legislative Aides shall aspire to have a full understanding of Senate proceedings and</u> Robert's Rules of Order.
- 5. <u>Complete a semesterly survey administered by the Senate Pro Tempore about their experience.</u>

B. Responsibilities of Senators to Legislative Aides

- 1. Notify legislative aides of all Senate and Senate Committee Meetings.
- 2. Engage with Legislative Aides to impart knowledge of the Student Senate.
- 3. Include Legislative Aides in their process of developing and drafting legislation.
- 4. Review Legislative Aide Reports with their Legislative Aides
- 5. Complete a semesterly survey administered by the Senate Pro Tempore about their experience.
- 6. Have no more than three legislative aides at any one time.

715.3 Confirmation Process

<u>Legislative Aides shall be confirmed in front of the Senate following an informal interview process facilitated by the Senate President.</u>

WHEREAS, Florida State University is an equal opportunity employer and educational provider committed to a policy of non-discrimination for any member of the University's community on the basis of race, creed, color, sex, religion, national origin, age, disability, genetic information, veterans' status, marital status, sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression, or any other legally protected group status.

WHEREAS, according to 8 U.S. Code § 1152: "No person shall receive any preference or priority or be discriminated against in the issuance of an immigrant visa because of the person's race, sex, nationality, place of birth, or place of residence."

WHEREAS, an estimated 17,000 international students in the U.S. are from the seven nations covered by the entry ban.

WHEREAS, currently, there are at least 60 FSU students who are affected by the executive order, one of whom is an FSU graduate student who had gone home to Iran and is currently stranded, as a direct result of this action

WHEREAS, Diversity and Inclusion have long been a part of the operating philosophy at the Florida State University. Here, valuing diversity means a workplace that respects and includes differences, recognizes the unique contributions that individuals with many types of differences can make, and creates a work environment that maximizes the potential of all employees and students.

We stand in solidarity with our fellow Seminoles and FSU community affected by the immigration ban and express deep concern for the consequences arising from this action.
