Whereas: As of March 9th, 2020, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, there have been 423 cases of COVID-19, the disease caused by the novel coronavirus, with 19 recorded deaths, and,

Whereas: According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, 35 states, including the state of Florida, have recorded cases of COVID-19, and,

Whereas: According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the State of Florida has 6 recorded cases of COVID-19, with 2 Floridians dying of the disease, and,

Whereas: The CDC finds that "the virus that causes COVID-19 seems to be spreading easily and sustainably in the community" and that U.S. COVID-19 cases include "imported cases in travelers, cases among close contacts of a known case, and community-acquired cases where the source of the infection is unknown," and,

Whereas: The CDC believes that "community-level nonpharmaceutical intervention, including school dismissals and social distancing in other settings (e.g., postponement or cancellation of mass gatherings and telework and remote-meeting options in workplaces)" are suitable methods of reducing community spread and "studies have shown that early layered implementation of these interventions can reduce the community spread and impact of infectious pathogens such as pandemic influenza, even when specific pharmaceutical treatments and vaccines are not available," and,

Whereas: Asian Americans have faced significant and unconscionable racism in the face of unsubstantiated fears related to the novel coronavirus, and,

Whereas: Asian Americans have faced not only xenophobia, but verbal and physical violence as a result of misinformation about the novel coronavirus, and, therefore,

Considering the urgent need to protect public health and the awful instances of hatred directed towards Asian Americans, be it resolved by the Seventy-second Student Senate at Florida State University that: The Student Senate, including the Programming Allocations Committee, the Resources and Travel Allocation Committee, and the Senate Finance Committee be bound by the following:

- 1: Not provide A&S fees, as defined by 800.2B, to the funding of any event expecting an attendance of over 40 individuals
- 2: Encourage Registered Student Organizations to not host events with an expected attendance of over 40 individuals

Be it further resolved that: The Student Senate strongly denounces any form of hatred or racism directed at the Asian American community

Be it further resolved that: The binding provisions of this resolution sunset on April 29th, 2020, unless revived by the Senate

807.6 RTAC and PAC Guidelines

- A. Organizations which received funds in Student Academic Programs or any other A&S Funding Board, Committee, or line item in the annual budget (with the exception of PAC, RTAC, or Senate Projects) shall be ineligible to receive funding from PAC or RTAC the same fiscal year in which they receive other funding. This does not apply to RSOs that received money from the organizational fund.
 - 1. RTAC is a supplemental source of funds for RSO travel. Therefore, RTAC shall not cover the full cost of any trip.

Purpose & Description: Update statutes regarding Transfer Leadership Institute' leadership team selection process. To be more inclusive, TLI will now operate in the Fall and Spring and they need to continue planning for the program. Currently, the 2020 leadership team was selected in January and would prefer to stay in the positions for the following year to April 2021. This Statute Revision, if passed, would go into effect immediately.

Statute Number(s): 303.2

Statute/Amendment Text 303.2 Transfer Leadership Institute

A. Purpose

The purpose of the Transfer Leadership Institute is to provide personal, professional, and leadership growth opportunities for ambitious transfer students through networking, programming, and educational experiences that impact the Florida State University student body and its surrounding community.

- B. Program
 - Participant Selection
 - a. The application will be made available to incoming transfer students at least two weeks before the start of the Fall <u>and</u> <u>Spring</u> semester and will close no later than the first week of the Fall <u>and Spring</u> semester.
 - Meetings
 - a. The Transfer Leadership Institute shall meet once a week for the duration of the program during the Fall Semester.

 Additional meetings may be held at the discretion of the Director in order to fulfill the stated purpose in 303.2 Section A.

C. Leadership Team Selection

1. Director

- a. The Director of the Transfer Leadership Institute shall be selected by the outgoing Leadership Team.
 - The Leadership Team is defined as any officer positions, including the Director, that have been appointed by the Executive Branch to fulfill the stated purpose in 303.2 Section A.
- b. The application for the Director of the Transfer Leadership Institute shall be made available on the Student Government Association Website the first week of the Spring Semester and close no later than the third week of the Spring Semester.
- b. The application for the Director of the Transfer Leadership
 Institute shall be made available on the Student
 Governance & Advocacy Website the week before Spring
 Break and close no later than 2 weeks before the final
 week of classes.
- c. Once selected by the outgoing Leadership Team, the candidate will then be forwarded to the Executive Branch for confirmation.

D. Responsibilities

The Responsibilities of the Director shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

The Director shall:

- Represent the interest of the Transfer Leadership Institute on the campus of Florida State University in accordance to the stated purpose.
- 2. Be responsible for the operation of the Transfer Leadership Institute.
- 3. Make and execute decisions on program structure of the Transfer Leadership Institute affiliated events, finance, and other activities with the advice of the Leadership Team, Student Body Vice President, and Student Government Advisor.
- 4. Recommend needed officer positions to the Executive Branch, in order to fulfill the stated purpose.

E. Removal from Office

 If the Director fails to fulfill the stated purpose, it will be up to the discretion of the Student Program Coordinator or Student Body Vice President to determine whether the Director shall be removed from office.

F. Vacancies

- If any vacancy occurs during the duration of the Transfer Leadership Institute that is under the Director, the Executive Branch shall appoint a person at the recommendation of the Director to fulfill the duties of said position.
 - a. If the Director position becomes vacant, then the Student Body Vice President shall fill in as the presiding Director until a new Director is selected.
 - b. The application for the Director of the Transfer Leadership Institute shall be made available within five (5) school days of the Director renouncing the position and shall remain open for no less than ten (10) school days.
 - c. The Executive Branch will then interview confirm a new Director from the applicant pool for the remainder of the Transfer Leadership Institute.
