**WHEREAS:** Stipends for these highly motivated and dedicated employees are far below national averages, and in some cases are as low as \$5000 for nine months, and

**WHEREAS:** Every graduate assistant is a graduate student, and

**WHEREAS:** Every graduate student must pay between \$700 and \$900 per semester in fees, and

**WHEREAS:** These fees constitute a large portion of their hard earned pay, and

**WHEREAS:** Some of the Top Twenty Five public universities waive these fees for graduate employees, and

**WHEREAS:** The Florida State University is working toward becoming a Top Twenty Five institution, and

**WHEREAS:** The Florida State University becoming a Top Twenty Five institution would have many social and economic benefits for the State of Florida.

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY-SIXTH STUDENT SENATE THAT:** We support HB 925 and SB 1420 and urge their passage in the Florida Legislature and advise the Governor to sign them into law.
