Chapter 205 Code of Ethics

History: Amended 44th Senate Bill 140. Amended by 49th Senate Bill 14. Revised by the 50th Senate Bill 2. Revised by the 56th Senate Bills 23 and 109. Revised by the 59th Senate Bill 51. Revised by the 60th Student Senate Bill 60.

205.1 This act shall be entitled "the Student Government Code of Ethics." The intent of this code is to strengthen the faith and confidence of the Student Body in Student Government.

205.2 Legislative intent and declaration of policy.

A. It is essential to the proper conduct and operation of the Student Body that its officials be independent and impartial, and that public office not be used for private gain. Student Body officers and employees hold their position for the benefit of the Student Body. Such officers and employees are bound to observe in their official acts the highest standards of ethics consistent with this code, recognizing that promoting the public interest and maintaining the respect of the student body in their Student Government must be the foremost concern.

B. It is the intent of this act to protect the integrity of Student Government by prescribing conflicts of interest and unethical practices. It shall serve as the basis of discipline for those who violate its provisions.

C. Any student has the right to file a complaint when they feel that a violation of the Code of Ethics has occurred with the Student Supreme Court.

1. Any organization has the right to establish additional ethical criteria or penalties in its constitution and bylaws.

205.3 Standards of Conduct

A. In order to preserve the integrity of the Florida State University Student Government Association, its officers and employees must disclose all potential or actual conflicts of interests.

1. Conflict of Interest means any business or professional activity or direct or indirect financial interest that would place a person in a position where there is an opportunity to disregard the public interests of the student body for his or her own private interests.

2. No officer or employee will judge or vote on any matter which would affect his or her private gain. No Executive Board member of a SGA funded organization may vote within a funding committee of Senate on an allocation to the organization in which they serve as an Executive Board member which requires Senate confirmation. This restriction will not apply to members' vote on the final annual budget, sweepings, or central reserves.

3. No officer or employee will induce or coerce another officer or employee with favor or retribution, either directly or through implication, to vote, render a decision, or to utilize the powers of his or her office to act in a prescribed manner.

4. Any vote, action, or judgment performed by an officer or employee who has a conflict of interest may be appealed with the Student Supreme Court. This must be done in a written, signed complaint submitted no later than three (3) days after the vote, act, or judgment in which the conflict occurs.

a. In Student Senate, a written and signed complaint shall be filed with the chair of Rules of Calendar, who will investigate that matter within 48 hours of receipt of complaint. Upon cause, the Chair shall forward the complaint and findings and a recommendation for penalties to the Student Supreme Court. The Student Supreme Court shall assign penalties for any Senator or officer of Senate who acts, judges, or votes with a conflict of interest.

The Sixty Sixth Student Senate

Resolution 44

Sponsored by Senator D. Patel

WHEREAS: The Student Government Association has adopted a Code of Ethics by which all officers and employees must follow, and

WHEREAS: The purpose of such a code is to ensure that “officers and employees are bound to observe in their official acts the highest standards of ethics consistent with this code, recognizing that promoting the public interest and maintaining the respect of the student body in their Student Government must be the foremost concern ”, and

WHEREAS: Student opinions regarding the Presidential Search Advisory Committee and the process as a whole have been expressed during public comments at their meetings, at the forums hosted by the search firms, and at the forums hosted by Student Body President Cavallaro, and

WHEREAS: Students and student organizations making public comment at these meetings have expressed broad disapproval of the structure and transparency of the Search Committee, called on the Board of Trustees to restructure the committee by increasing student representation, and demanded the consideration of only candidates with significant academic experience, and

WHEREAS: The 66th Student Senate, the official representative body of students at Florida State University, passed Resolution 40 on June 11th, 2014 stating “We disapprove of the structure and transparency of the Presidential Search Committee”, calling on the Board of Trustees to restructure the Presidential Search Advisory Committee by increasing student representation to one third, and demanding the consideration of at least one candidate with significant academic experience, and

WHEREAS: The Congress of Graduate Students, the official representative body of graduate students at Florida State University, passed Resolution 12 on June 16th, 2014, stating “[COGS] disapproves of the current structure and level of transparency of the Presidential Search Advisory Committee”, calling on the Board of Trustees to restructure the Presidential Search Advisory Committee by increasing student representation to one third, and demanding the consideration of only candidates with significant academic experience, and

WHEREAS: These expressions of uniform dissatisfaction have been made in the presence of, or been sent to the desk of, Student Body President Stefano Cavallaro, and

WHEREAS: The Student Body President is established by Constitution to Serve as “the representative of the Student Body on the Board of Trustees”, and

WHEREAS: Student Body President Cavallaro neglected to mention any of these opinions, nor any kind of student criticism of the presidential search process, when speaking as a Trustee at the most recent Board of Trustees Meeting on June 27th, 2014, and

WHEREAS: Student Body President further misrepresented the expressed sentiments of the student body by saying of the search process “I think that makes students happy, knowing that there is a clear process, what to expect, and I think they are also very happy that it's in September.”, and

WHEREAS: Student Body President Cavallaro further misrepresented the expressed sentiments of the student body by saying “ I think at the end of the day, students just want a leader. They want a leader for this university, who's going to move us forward, and I think that's hard to define, you can't define who's the right leader, what's the perfect pedigree to create a leader but I think you know it when you see it .”, and

WHEREAS: Student Body President Stefano Cavallaro’s remarks at the June 27th, 2014 Board of Trustees meeting blatantly contradict Senate Resolution 40, COGS Resolution 12, and all public student comment, and

WHEREAS: These were the only remarks President Cavallaro used to describe student opinion during the Board of Trustees discussion on the Presidential Search, and

WHEREAS: This misrepresentation stands in conflict with 205.4.E.1, that “No officer or employee will willfully misrepresent himself or herself while acting in his or her official capacity”, and

WHEREAS: This omission of facts stands in conflict with 205.4.E.2, that “No officer or employee will withhold information or documentation when mandated, or provide false or misleading information or documentation.”, and

WHEREAS: The actions of the Student Body President demonstrate a willful failure to serve as a “representative of the Student Body on the Board of Trustees”, and

WHEREAS: This willful misrepresentation of the student body constitutes malfeasance, that is, the knowing commission of an act that is wrongful, and

WHEREAS: Malfeasance is an impeachable offense.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY-SIXTH STUDENT SENATE THAT:
Student Body President Stefano Cavallaro is hereby impeached.
