CHAPTER 910

OFFICE OF UNDERGRADUATE RESEARCH AND CREATIVITY
ENDEAVORS

Revised by the 65th Senate Bill 8.

910.1 Creation and Purpose

A. Creation

This act shall create a bureau of the Student Government Association known as the Student Council for Undergraduate Research and Creativity ~~Endeavors~~ (SCURCE)

B. Purpose

1. SCURCE shall implement and oversee the Florida State University Undergraduate Research Journal, The Owl, as a means to engage the student body and highlight student research.
2. SCURCE shall strive to increase the number of students engaged in research projects at Florida State University.
3. SCURC shall serve as a central resource for undergraduate students to request funding for academic conferences at which they are a primary presenter.

910.2 Membership

Participation is open to students at the Florida State University. Approval by the current Board of Directors is required for membership.

910.3 Board of Directors

A. Membership

1. The Board of Directors shall consist of thirteen (13) members all of whom shall be students at the Florida State University.

B. Powers and Duties

The Board shall:

1. Solicit undergraduate research manuscripts for publication in the Owl.
2. Select manuscripts and determine required editing.
3. Annually publish and promote The Owl.

4. Formalize via statute any decision to publish The Owl bi-annually.
5. Both solicit and respond to requests for outreach presentations promoting and explaining undergraduate research.
6. Provide one-on-one mentoring when possible, for students interested in pursuing undergraduate research.
7. Advertise the funding opportunity for presentations at academic conferences.
8. Review all undergraduate funding applications for conferences and grant approval upon qualification and availability of funds.
 - A. Qualifications include: completed application must be turned in, at least 12 business days before the conference; with proof of acceptance to conference; must include FSUID and be registered as FSU undergraduate student at time of the conference; must be a primary presenter; provide verification from department travel representative stating any financial support for the conference provided by the department.
 - B. Funding applications shall be distributed by reimbursement processes; all receipts must be turned in within 30 days of the conference. The grant will be cancelled if failure to do so.
 - C. Funding applications shall be available online. Applications shall adhere to the applications instructions for guidance on submission.
 - D. Academic conference funding shall be divided into two periods per fiscal year.
 - E. Applicants shall be notified in a timely manner of their status of funding and will be recorded for the University's records, in order to promote Florida State University's academic accomplishments.
 - F. Paperwork must be completed as required by the FSU Travel Office and the SA&O Accounting Office.

910.4 Meetings

- A. Those Board members directly responsible for the publication of The Owl shall hold a minimum of one (1) meeting per month during the academic year.
 - 1. Additional meetings shall be scheduled as needed.
- B. Those Board members directly responsible for outreach shall hold a minimum of one (1) meeting at the start of the Fall and Spring semesters.
 - 1. Direct and frequent communications with the directors shall be maintained by these Board members throughout the semester to ensure efficiency and accountability.

910.5 Directors

- A. Selection and Term of Office
 - 1. The director shall be chosen by the Board and are subject to confirmation by the Student Senate.
 - 2. The directors' term shall not exceed three (3) academic terms.
 - 3. There shall be two (2) directors.
- B. Powers and Duties
 - 1. One (1) director shall serve as Editor-in-Chief of The Owl.
 - (a) May appoint a Co-editor-in-Chief of The Owl.
 - (b) Will plan and maintain procedural bylaw operations.
 - (c) Will be responsible for the final approval of all Owl manuscripts.
 - (d) Will ensure that SCURCE complies with all relevant provisions of Chapter 304 and Chapter 900 as well as Title VIII (The Finance Code).
 - (e) Will carry out decisions assigned by the majority of the editorial board.
 - (f) Shall have the authority to appoint and remove all members of SCURC.
 - 2. One (1) director shall oversee and manage all outreach conducted by SCURCE.

- (a) Shall oversee the processes and responsibilities of the liaison: Application liaison and Accounting liaison.
- (b) These liaisons shall be appointed from among the members of the board.
- (c) These liaisons shall be financially certified.

A. Application liaison

- (a) Shall oversee all applications for academic conferences.
- (b) Shall work with advisor to approve or deny applications based on the qualification requirements, available funds, and adhere to the finance code.

B. Accounting liaison

- (a) Shall be responsible for turning in all receipts and documentation to the SGA accounting offices within the time restraints.
- (b) Shall work with the advisor to ensure fiscal responsibility with granting funds.
- (c) Shall make sure all funding adheres to the finance code.
- (d) Shall grant funds based on a first-come-first-serve basis.

910.6 Removal from Office

The Board may recommend removal of any of its members or directors by a two-thirds (2/3) vote. Removal of any bureau officer must comply with relevant Student Body Statutes or by impeachment from the Senate.

910.7 Vacancies

Vacancies shall be filled by the original process, and the person filling the vacancy shall serve the remainder of the term of office.

WHEREAS: Section 7.05 of the Rules and Procedures illustrates the duties and responsibilities of the Senate Student Affairs Committee, and

WHEREAS: The students of Florida State University shall have a "Student Government Street Team" to serve as the student body survey and representation team, and

WHEREAS: The duties and expectations of the Student Government Street Team shall be mandated within section "H" of 7.05 of Rules and Procedure, and

WHEREAS: The Student Government Street Team will allow Student Government to continue to gear legislation and overall campus improvement specifically towards the student needs, and

WHEREAS: Students will be able to access a think tank of ideas so they may better understand the processes and purpose of the Student Government Association, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SIXTY-FIFTH STUDENT SENATE THAT: The Student Government Street Team be created and overseen by the Senate Student Affairs Committee.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That a copy of this resolution be sent to:

7.05 The Senate Student Affairs Committee shall:

- A. Review organizations funded by Student Government to determine their compliance with the Student Body Statutes and policy.
- ~~B. Review issues pertaining to student body and inform the Senate as to any pertinent action.~~
- C. Shall conduct forums for students to express their concerns. The committee may work with the Executive Branch town halls series.
- D. Oversee and develop new services and projects for the Student Body.
- E. Conduct other hearings, investigations, and undertake such other business, as the Senate shall determine. □
- F. The Student Affairs Committee shall create and maintain a Master Senate Calendar, with the dates, times and locations of major campus events, as submitted by any student organization, agency, bureau or other student program, to be distributed to all Senators with their weekly agenda. With this Calendar, the committee will assign representatives of the Senate to attend these events to show support and to give a report to the entire Senate body during the closing announcements portion of the Senate each week. It is the responsibility of the Student Affairs Chairman to input the information received into the SGA Master Calendar.
- G. Shall be responsible for maintaining the Senate table at the Union on every Market Wednesday.

H. Oversee the implementation and productivity of the Student Government Association Street Team, which shall consist of any Florida State University student interested in promoting the Student Government Association, regularly surveying the student population, gathering data and results for a Student Government Association think tank, and representing the Student Government Association at various Florida State University events, under these conditions:

(1). Any student in good standing with Florida State University may apply and be accepted to be a member of the Student Government Street Team, at no cost to that member.

(2). Each member must attend one (1) Student Affairs Committee meeting per month, designated by the Chair, where they will receive their assignments and report back to the committee at the next meeting. If the member has more than three (3) absences, the member will be asked to resign. Attendance to Market Wednesday to table with the Student Affairs committee is optional but encouraged.

(3). All survey data and ideas gathered from the student population, on behalf of the Street Team, shall be entered into an online database or think tank for the purposes of the Student Government Association and the student body. The Student Affairs Committee Chair shall designate a Public Relations liaison for this purpose.
