Attachment #2: Proposed Proviso Language, FY 2024-25 COGS Budget

Section 1: Bangladeshi Student Association

Pursuant to University policy, no funds shall be expended on raw foods that

need to be cooked.

Section 2: Ecology & Evolution Research & Discussion Group

Only one (1) iPad may be paid for with these budgeted funds.

Section 3: Southeast Review

Southeast Review shall have a distribution plan where FSU students have the opportunity to receive free copies of the Review.

COGS Code 201.9 is waived as it relates to the printing of bound copies of the Southeast Review.

Section 4: COGS Administration - OPS Wages and Pay Rates

- Speaker: 12 hours per week at the rate of \$13 per hour (44 weeks total)
- Deputy Speaker for Finance: 10 hours per week at the rate of \$13 per hour (44 weeks total)
- Deputy Speaker for Communications: 10 hours per week at the rate of \$13 per hour (44 weeks total)
- Deputy Speaker for Judicial Affairs: 10 hours per week at the rate of \$13 per hour (44 weeks total)

Section 5: COGS Conference Presentation and Attendance Grants:

Notwithstanding conflicting COGS Code, for the 2024-2025 FY, the domestic Presentation Grant shall be \$300 and the domestic and international Attendance Grant shall be \$180. No later than February 1, 2025, the Speaker shall appoint a committee to study whether to permanently change the grant amounts in the COGS Code, which shall report to the Assembly before final passage of the COGS FY 2025-2026 Budget.

Section 6: For the 2024-2025 FY, the grants shall be allocated over three periods in which the following amounts are set aside for each period:

Presentation Grants:

\$100,000 between July 1 and October 31

\$100,000 between November 1 and February 28

\$100,000 between March 1 and June 30

Attendance Grants:

\$24,000 between July 1 and October 31

\$24,000 between November 1 and February 28 \$24,000 between March 1 and June 30

At the end of each period within the 2024-2025 FY, the funds unencumbered after processing all applications shall immediately roll over into the following period.
