Purpose & Description: The FSU Iranian Student Association is planning to host a Nowruz Celebration at <u>Student Union Ballroom E</u> on <u>March 15th (from 6:30 PM - 11 PM)</u> to share the rich cultural heritage of Iran with the Florida State University community.

Nowruz, also known as the <u>Persian New Year</u>, marks the first day of spring and the beginning of the year in the Iranian calendar. Falling on the vernal equinox, Nowruz is a celebration of nature's rebirth, symbolizing new beginnings, renewal, and the revitalization of life. This ancient festival, which has roots in Zoroastrianism, is one of the oldest and most cherished festivities celebrated by Iranians and many other countries around the world.

<u>Number of attendees: 260 people:</u> We anticipate <u>150 students</u>, 120 Iranian and 30 non-Iranian guests, plus <u>110 families</u>, reflecting the multicultural celebration of Nowruz.

The Nowruz Celebration aims to:

Educate: Provide insights into the history, significance, and rituals associated with Nowruz, promoting a deeper understanding of this ancient celebration.

Unite: Bring together students, faculty, staff, and the broader Tallahassee community to foster cultural exchange and mutual respect.

Showcase Art: Highlight the rich cultural tapestry of Iran (Persia) through traditional music, dance, and visual arts.

Build Community: Strengthen the sense of community among Iranian students and those interested in Iranian culture through shared experiences and celebrations.

Celebrate Key Themes: Focus on themes of renewal, hope, and the joy of life, which are central to the spirit of Nowruz.

The Nowruz Ceremony is more than just an event; it's a deep dive into the culture that has celebrated the Iranian New Year for thousands of years. At the heart of Nowruz, which is the most important celebration for Iranians, lies the Sofreh Haft Seen. This is a special setup with seven items, each starting with the letter "Seen" (ω (in Persian. These items represent important wishes for the new year, like happiness, health, and wealth. Our goal is to create a space that not only showcases the tradition of Nowruz but also spreads its messages of renewal and togetherness.

Advertisement:

We will advertise this event via various channels including our Facebook page, Instagram account, email, and our Telegram group to ensure widespread awareness and participation. To promote the event, we also plan to distribute flyers, continuing our traditional advertising approach.

Funding Request:

We kindly request a fund of \$7,292 to support the Nowruz Celebration organized by the FSU Iranian Student Association. The funds will be used to cover expenses such as food for the participants and supplies for specific Nowruz decoration and activities like poetry recital.

The celebration of Nowruz allows us to highlight an important part of Iranian heritage and promotes cultural diversity and inclusiveness at FSU. Your contribution will help create a meaningful event that brings people together.

* Ticket prices for <u>families</u> will be <u>\$35 for adults and \$15 for children</u>. We've explored ticket sales through Zelle or Venmo, aiming for a straightforward transaction process where funds are deposited directly into the COGS account. We intend to issue receipts for these transactions, record guests' names, and confirm attendance at the door.

Statute Revision or Addition 32nd Congress of Graduate Students

Bill #: 13

Sponsored by: Felix Balak

Date: February 19, 2024

Purpose & Description: A bill to remove the remainder of COGS Code language regarding C-SAC.

Be it enacted by the Thirty-Second Congress of Graduate Students:

Section 1: Chapter 210 of COGS Code shall be stricken, as follows:

- C) If a speaker has been contracted by the Organization for the event for which funds were embargoed, this shall constitute sufficient assurances under §210.4, though sufficient assurances may be demonstrated in other ways as well.
- If the event does not take place, the embargoed funds shall become available to C-SAC for general allocation.
- 210.6 C-SAC shall be empowered to establish guidelines for considering funding requests which may be amended by a majority vote of COGS; such amendments C-SAC may not amend. These guidelines shall be adopted or amended by a twothirds (66%) majority of the total number of C-SAC members. In forming the guidelines C-SAC shall keep in mind the unique mission of the Congress of Graduate Students and emphasize programs which expand academic opportunity over those which are purely social in nature.
- 210.7 Upon allocating funds, C-SAC shall present a Resolution to COGS for final approval.
 - C) This Resolution shall include a description of the allocation that C-SAC has made.
 - D) This Resolution shall be sponsored by the Chair of C-SAC who will speak in any instance of objection. If an objection is raised, the allocation is then debated by the Congress and approved by a majority vote.

Speaker: This resolution is being moved to be presented before the funding requests. Duties of the Speaker were turned over to Deputy Speaker Burns.

Rowan: This resolution is to make internal rules more readable. It is currently 18 rules without any real order to it. The new rules are broken down into categories in order to make it more easily followed. Other rules have adjusted in order to make the rules of
