New Business:

- Bill 109
 - Senator Sandoval has 5 mins for opening
 - Sandoval - CPE is request this amount to fund for the printing of their class catalogs for the year. We have a new price that we would like to present that CPE and Aaron Ellis believe will fund them.
 - There is only 500 in their expense account which is not enough for one semester of print.
 - They cannot use student pubs for free prints and their old printing manufacture has moved locations
 - The new request being presented is a transfer of \$1748.00
 - CPE prints two catalogs a year, last year was \$748 and cost is more because they are printing for spring and fall. This amount includes 10 newspaper boxes for \$100.00 that will be able to store the catalogues and advertise them on campus
 - Sponsor yields with 2 minutes and 38 seconds remaining
 - Chair Warren- Are there any technical non debatable questions
 - Seeing non
 - Napoli motions to move into round table
 - Fisher seconds
 - Have y'all looked into where exactly on campus you could put the boxes and if you need certain permits for them.

 - We haven't yet look in to the exact locations, but we could also place some of the boxes close to campus that is technically off campus.
 - Morales- Where would you place them off campus?
 - Arron Ellis - All saints area, rail road square
 - Fisher- You should check with university where the boxes should or could be laid
 - Napoli - Motion to amend bill 109 to \$1748.00
 - Morales seconds
 - Chair Warren- Does the sponsor find it friendly?
 - Sandoval finds amendment friendly
 - Durham is in full support of this bill and CPE but, suggests maybe creating a bill solely for the boxes, we don't know where or the exact amount of the boxes. Would like the committee to only fund catalogs?
 - Aaron Ellis- The exact amount of newspaper boxes that it would fund is \$100.00 for ten boxes. We are getting a really good deal from the company.
 - Senator Fisher-How have you been distributing catalogs in the past?
 - Aaron Ellis- We have been leaving them at establishments on and off campus
 - Fink- So the cost of prints 752 for just one semester and 10 boxes cost 100 dollars all together.
 - Napoli believes the new price is a good deal and the boxes will make it easily to distribute the catalog on campus
 - Sandoval-Also we could do satellite locations like the school of engineering.
 - Fisher- Regardless we are advertising CPE to students with the boxes
 - Fink- Moves to call to question
 - Fisher- Seconds
