- Opening Statement:

- Hi, my name is Ashley Boudreaux. I'm a first-year presidential scholar here. I am majoring in English Language and Literature. I am looking into pursuing a double major in human rights and social justice. I am a very passionate and driven person which is why I am looking forward to this opportunity to serve in this position. Mental health and mental illness is such a prevalent issue within our generation and especially within the college demographic. It is one that is severely unaddressed, and it is addressed in a damaging way towards those who are struggling with mental illness because of its romantic portrayal in media. That is why I am passionate about serving in a role that can genuinely make change for the Florida State student body in terms of this issue that is universal. I want to work towards providing better education and resources for the student body to improve the overall mental health of the student body. Thank you.

- Rounds of Questioning:

- **Vice-Chair Crocker** – I'm reading in your application about wanting to ensure that students get health care referrals and are seen as quickly as possible. Do you have any ideas on how you could expedite that process on students getting seen for medical conditions?
  - **Candidate Boudreaux** - So, I am not entirely sure yet of what that would look like, but I would want to discuss that more with the University Health Services. I am thinking that there could be a middle person to advocate for the students and work directly with university mental health students to work towards organizing that. But obviously that ranges outside of my expertise at the moment but it is a goal that I want to work towards, and I want to discuss feasible options with the university.
- **Senator Vollick** - In your application, I see that one of your goals is to educate. Can you give an example of how you plan to educate the Florida State community?
  - **Candidate Boudreaux** - One of the things that I really wanted to do after speaking with the director is to work with existing campus organizations in order to put on events where we can have people come in to speak and educate about the resources we have on campus. I am interested in drafting my own program. I would like to work with the Pride Student Union in addressing mental health within the LGBTQ+ community and working with the Asian American Student Union talking about mental health within interracial groups and working on events like that.

- **Senator Salazar** – I saw on your application that you are a freshman. Do you feel confident in your knowledge on RSOs and communicating with other entities?
  - **Candidate Boudreaux** - Yes. I do have a rudimentary understanding of how things work. But I want to emphasize that I am a freshman and am new on campus which means I have a lot of room to grow. There are candidates who have been at the school longer, but it also means that they have less time to work on things. I have the next four years in front of me to grow in the organization and that is a strength that I hold.

    - Hi everyone, my name is Jenna Kruse. I am a senior honors student majoring in psychology and minoring in Spanish. I'm running for this position for two reasons. First, I believe that students should involve themselves in communities that they benefit from. As a third-year student living on campus, I would like to give back to the housing community and contribute to a positive experience for others. I've gained friendships and a sense of belonging from living on campus, so I'd like to do the same for others. Secondly, serving as the Assistant Director of Finance specifically is the best position for me to contribute because I have experience in money management. If selected, I have three main goals: I intend to be

approachable and knowledgeable, I want to start and manage an advocacy and philanthropy committee to serve students on campus, and I also intend to manage the IRHC budget so the organization can comfortably host events and conferences.

○ Rounds of Questioning:

- **Vice-Chair Crocker** – I'm reading about your experience being a board member at The Plant. Can you expand upon that and how it makes you qualified for this position?
  - **Candidate Kruse** – For a little bit of background, The Plant is an organization off campus. It serves as a community center and offers free food, clothing, art supplies, space, etc. It is a space for people to coexist and explore their passions. I served as a volunteer last year and I noticed that they did not have any documentation for money made during events, so I started helping them manage their funds and track that so that the owner didn't have to pay out of pocket. I know how to manage money and I've done so at a larger capacity, so I think I'm qualified for this position.
- **Senator LoBianco** – I really liked the goal that you wanted to start in starting a philanthropy committee. Do you have a plan for how you would start this?
  - **Candidate Kruse** - So, it's written into the bylaws that this can exist, but it hasn't existed prior because of the workload and lack of effort willing to start it.
