  - o Opening Statement:
    - Candidate Khosh: Hi everyone. I once sat in on the senate meeting where they did the OGA agenda and I believe there are a lot thigs that I think we can do better in OGA. Smoother processes, better communication, and overall I want to make sure that the voices of the general student body are heard when we take agendas to the capitol, and that we don't have a ton of issues when we bring the bill to the senate floor. I want to make

sure the senate liaison and OGA have good communication when coming up with the agenda. I will hopefully in a role of Director of Communications, something I'm really keen on. Thank you.

## Round of Questioning

- Senator Lento: I know you are very involved on campus, how do you plan on balancing OGA with everything else?
  - Candidate Khosh: OGA used to be a major role but now it is not, so I feel like I am going to be dedicating a lot of my time to this role, as it takes my experience with the university at an involvement level, but also my professional experience, as this is the avenue I am looking to go in. I am hoping to dedicate a lot of my time to this, and I have set out a good calendar for the semester.
- Senator Birdsong: What was it about OGA that drew you to be on the Board of Directors, and why do you think you specifically make a good candidate for it?
  - Candidate Khosh: I am looking to find a way that we can avoid what happened in OGA last year and have a more productive legislative session. People on OGA should have experience in some sort of legislative role in the real world, although experience on campus is awesome and great too. I was a legislative intern for a session in the spring, and then I worked on Capitol Hill as an intern in the summer, and then I was an intern for two years in high school as well. So, a lot of the things I've learned form that I want to transfer over to OGA to make it more productive. I also want to be able to translate the legislative language to students so they understand all of the laws and policies that will be passed.
- Senator Windlan: Are there any issues that you are passionate about bringing towards the legislative agenda?
  - <u>Candidate Khosh:</u> Having worked in session, there are a lot of topics that I am passionate about that unfortunately may not be on the top of everyone's agenda. I think for me in this role, it is less about what I want but more so what the average students wants. There are a lot of topics and bills that will be passed that affect students, so it is important to make everyone aware of those things and getting their input.
