- **Candidate for Confirmation: [Lilly Mae Stewart: Freshman Class Council, Vice President]**

- Opening Statement:

- Candidate Stewart: Hi everybody, thank you for hearing me today. I am super excited to hopefully be a part of class councils. It's an organization that I know I have been wanting to be a part of ever since I heard about it. I did something very similar in high school. I was the treasurer of my class board, and our job was to host events freshman through senior year. Fun events for our class and to welcome as many participants and viewers as possible. These events were fundraisers in order to eventually host our prom. So, I do have a lot of experience in event planning and brainstorming some creative opportunities for my class as I have done that in the past, specifically for FCCs I think this is an amazing opportunity considering it is the first time that we have had one. So, I think the members of this freshman class council really have a great opportunity to get this role started. And, have some super amazing events that can continue on as class council is continued for freshmen in the future. So, personally I have a lot of great ideas that I think freshmen would enjoy. And, would help them in many endeavors at Florida State whether it be socially, personally, professionally, academically, and just with their personal being in general. At Florida state this semester, I have had the opportunity to be a part of the Freshman Leadership Institute and I am also in the honors program in FSU, and I think these two opportunities have shown me a bunch of different avenues and opportunities that FSU offers for freshman for students in general. And I would love to be able to share my knowledge with other freshmen in helping them explore these different opportunities in FSU and Tallahassee in general. - Round of Questioning:

- Senator Smith: What leadership role would you say in your past has prepared you most for the freshman class council vice president, and how did it prepare you?
 - Candidate Stewart: So, in the past, like I mentioned I was the treasurer of my class board throughout high school, and I think that that experience will really transfer over to this class council experience. I worked very closely with 4 other people on the team.

And I think that will transfer to the team and me leading the four other executive or 4 executive roles as well as the other chair positions. So, I think that that experience has helped me a lot in communication styles and making sure that everyone has distinguished roles and are able to keep up with a certain timeline

- Senator Lalani: What do you think would be the biggest challenge that you face in leading to this Freshman class council given how new it is and how do you plan on overcoming that
 - Candidate: Stewart: considering we are starting late in the semester and pretty much all of our other events will be pretty late in the semester pretty much all of our events will be next semester. I think that is the biggest challenge to overcome. I think we need to get the ball rolling very quickly so were able to make a lot of things happen in a short amount of time because I would like to give freshman as many opportunities as they can in their first year. So I think it is very important to make sure that everyone is on the same page with that and starting as soon as we can over Christmas breaks so that we can get a great event starting right at the beginning of the semester, and roll out events very quickly so we can make the biggest impact in a short amount of time
- Senator Grant: You mentioned you were in the Freshman Leadership Institute, I was wondering what you learned from that that you can use to benefit yourself in this role?
 - Senator Stewart: I feel like I learned some great professional skills and just a few minor things that freshmen should do that many people don't know about to start. Like I said creating a LinkedIn which is something I did within the freshman leadership institute. And I feel like because of that opportunity I gained info on how to create one and that it was just an important thing to do and minor things like that. Like learning how to do an elevator pitch and such would be something I would like to help educate new freshmen that may not have those specific mentors or those traditional leadership workshop things to do.
- Senator Nguyen: What are ways that you think you will boost engagement because I know the freshman class council is such a new thing, how do you think you will bring that engagement and people will come to those events?
 - Senator Stewart: I hope to be very active on our social media with not only promoting events but additionally I would like to post question answer forms 1-2 times a month. That way even if a freshman is not able to attend an event or have. Specific questions or just kind of need mentoring in any specific area that they want, they can submit their question and one of the members of the class council can be in charge for that session to answer with an appropriate response or if they don't have the knowledge seek it from somewhere else. Or, direct the freshman that is asking the question somewhere to where they can find the answer rot that question like a certain department or link them with a mentor.

○ Opening Statement:

- Candidate Marshall Widdman: Good afternoon, Chair Windlan and Vice Chair Larancuent and to the members of the Internal Affairs committee. My name is Marshall Widdman I am a senior studying political science as well as a former senator in 75th Student Senate. I served as ARTAC Chair, Sweepings chair, a member of the student academic programming committee, and judiciary committee. Speaking on professional experience I have also served as a congressional intern within the office of Congressman Daniel Webster's DC office. I am looking forward to answering any questions you have. Thank you very much.

○ Round of Questioning:

- Senator Lalani: How do you think your experience as a member of the 75th senate and everything you have accomplished in there how do you believe that is going to translate or help you in your new position as Parliamentarian?
 - Candidate Widdman: One thing for me is the connections and relationships I have already built within the Senate. With the current leadership team President Cofer and Pro-Tempore Gorlick, I think I have a good working relationship with them and just the Senate as a whole. I consider myself to be very approachable to the Senate and I think that if I'll be able to hit the ground running with some of the ideas I had within my application

- Senator Smith: I noticed that you were at the forefront of the pledge against bullying campaign how did you think that experience has affected your professional development?
 - Candidate Widdman: Yeah, so that was my very first project that is something I started in high school through my role as the president of the interact club and we partnered up with a local sponsor as well as Osceola county commissioner. And we were really able to spread that program out into Osceola public schools and I think that just this program overall or being in that role in that program helped me grow my experience of working with other students from different backgrounds, different schools, cities and that really helped and will help me in this role as well.
- Senator Grant: Do you plan on doing anything different from the last Parliamentarian?
 - Candidate Widdman: Yes, so Reagan was awesome. I think she was a great Parliamentarian. She really put a face to the role and was really approachable in the role. I think that will be something I will continue to do. Also serving as a full year term as a Senator I think that I do have that experience going into that role that will help me catch any errors that might be in legislation, or being able to look at legislation. We have passed this last senate and that is going to conflict and being able to look at things like that and you haven't been through that and worked through that it is going to be something harder to me.  - Senator Velazquez: Full transparency I did not write this, this was given to me by Andres Cubillos he is the president of Florida Purg and this is something he has been wanting to do for a while. We talked about it last session but we couldn't get it through in time. So now we are here in the 76th. If you want to scroll down a little bit chair, so we can show what the bill really does so basically what it does is scratches out the Garnet and Gold voting commission which is something I believe started under President Gasserbach term two years ago that has kind of fallen out. I don't really think they have a commission at this point it's just a piece of statutes there is no actual tangible work behind it right now, so they decided to rename it and rework the inner working of it, so has a civic engagement board we go through and highlight the different positions within that board and I will take any questions.

- **Bill #3: Sponsored by Senator Windlan**
 - Opening Statement:
 - Senator Windlan: So this is a really, simple bill. It is a simple revision to statutes. To move the Internal Affairs Bureau Review Process permanently to the fall. Every year, annually, the internal affairs committee is responsible for conducting Bureau review. Where we have all the different Student government Bureaus presenting what they do. We go ahead and review together and decide if we think Bureaus should still exist in student government or any recommendations we have. Then we put those recommendations for the different bureaus in the form of resolutions for every single bureau. It is a very lengthy process and the last bureau review we just conducted in the fall, according to statutes a Bureau review is supposed to be conducted in the spring but for the past couple of election cycles it was not conducted at all. Former Chair Salazar had it conducted last fall so we could be in compliance with statutes but since statutes still say Bureau review happens in the spring then we would fall out of compliance with statutes even though we just conducted Bureau review. So this is basically just a technical change to change student body statutes so that bureau review permanently happens in the fall. And it will work out because Bureau review has enough time because we do not have much new business during that time.
