- Bill #18 Sponsored by Senator Bettley A transfer of \$1930.80 is made from Senate Projects to Sustainable Campus to fund 2 ADA-accessible raised garden beds at the Seminole Organic Garden.
- Chair Bettley relinquishes the chair to Senator Dale

 Opening: This bill transfers money from the Senate Projects account to Sustainable Campus for two ADA-accessible beds. This is something we've been working on for a while in the Sustainability Ad-Hoc, and we want to pass this as soon as possible because the price fluctuates depending on the wood and time. A lot of the research was done by the Director of Sustainability, Juan Bustamante.

- **Bill #19** Sponsored by Senator Bettley To fund 7 U-Bike Locks as part of Sustainable Campus' bike rental program.
 - Opening: Provides funding for 7 U bike locks, and gives them to Sustainable Campus to oversee the rental process for the locks. If Sustainable Campus does not want to oversee the process, it would go back to Senate Projects. If something falls through, I plan to withdraw.
 - General Questioning
 - Vice Chair Burton Where would students go to rent the locks?
 - Chair Bettley Same location where the bikes are rented, unless we'd have to oversee the process then it would probably be at Market Wednesday
 - Senator Dale Were only 7 requested or do we not have funding for more?
 - Chair Bettley This is a test run and the max we wanted to spend was \$150 so to keep it under that number, the max we could do is 7.
 - Senator McEntyre Was there a poll done to see how many people wanted or asked for this resource
 - Chair Bettley There was no poll done, but this is more so that we needed a solution to the problem of the stolen bikes.

- Vice-Chair Burton I'm in favor and it lays the groundwork for more sustainable options on campus

- Budget Process Updates
 - Motion to Suspend Rules of Procedure
 - Senator Dale moves
 - Senator Mantilla seconds
 - Chair Bettley: We're looking at pushing Budget Week to the spring instead. Sweepings would stay in the fall, and the 75th Senate wouldn't have a Budget in the fall, it would pick back up in the spring. In place of the Budget for the year, we'd do a budget audit to see where all the money is actually going and what's needed.
 - Senator Mantilla: Are you worried about timing?
 - Chair Bettley: That's why we were considering closing the applications very soon after syllabus week. Also, in the fall there were around 10 line-items with missing requests. So the hope is to education in the mean-time so that we can enforce stricter deadlines.
 - Vice-Chair Burton: So there wouldn't be a Budget Week in the fall, but there would still be funding available? And we'll use that time to gather information from organizations, and then make the Budget in spring based on our research from the fall?
 - Chair Bettley: Correct
 - Senator Dale: I like that idea a lot actually.
