New Business:

- **Bill 46** Sponsored by Senators Bettley and Chehaitli To implement and supply free menstrual product dispensers on Florida State University's campus.
 - **Opening**: Bill provides tampon and pad dispensers on our campus, and we will be taking money from Senate Projects to fund the dispensers themselves, and a big supply of pads and tampons to get the program started. We had multiple meetings with CHAW and other organizations across the country to figure out the

format/layout from places with similar programs. Prioritizing inclusivity and the locations will be outside the bathrooms, tampons, and pads are from the supplier that is already used by the CHAW Center.

- General Questioning
 - Senator Dale: After the first round of tampons and pads run out, will there be funding to replenish these resources?
 - Senator Chehaitli: Senate Projects gets these types of programs started, and CHAW said they would gauge the amount needed. CHAW provides the condoms around campus and they will be overseeing that. The nature of Senate Projects is just starting this and seeing which areas have the most traffic. CHAW said they can continue with it, and we are giving them a lot of money to get this program started- \$5853.91.
- Roundtable Debate
 - Senator Dale: We need to pass this, its a no-brainer and involves the health of our students. Its important to make things accessible to students.

- Closing: This is the best way to get the program started, and to increase accessibility of health productsfor students. Period poverty is something very prominent on campus, and there are similar bills for elementary and middle schools in the Florida Legislature.
