- Candidate for Confirmation: [Jackson Boisvert, Executive Branch Attorney General]
 - Opening Statement:
 - Jackson Boisvert: Good evening Internal Affairs. my name is Jackson Boisvert. As you may have seen in my application and resume I have a strong leadership background on campus and a firm commitment to upholding the values of fairness, justice, and integrity within our FSU community. From my experience as the Executive Vice-President in IFC as well as my experience from the 74th and 75th judiciary committee, I am well prepared for the role of attorney general. My time in Senate was also spent as the Vice-Chair of PAC, and last summer I was called upon to revamp FSU Panama City's election code. This experience has shown my dedication to a more transparent and efficient government, as well as my deeper understanding of FSU statutes. As FSU;s Attorney General, I plan to promote transparency and fairness by working closely with the Judiciary Committee, the Executive Branch, the Department of Student Conduct, and other stakeholders to ensure that our policies and procedures are clear, consistent, and applied fairly across our university community. This includes advocating for more transparent meeting minutes across our committees, and additionally I will work to help streamline legal processes in both SGA and the university's legal framework. I aim to identify areas where unnecessary bureaucracy can be reduced in our statutes and processes can be made more efficient. This will allow for a more effective resolution of legal matters and a much more agile legal system. Furthermore I am to serve as a trusted resource and advisor on legal and statutory proceedings in the legislative and executive branches of student government. This includes defending potential impeachment hearings, and ensuring the processes adhere to the principles of fairness, and due process. Lastly, I plan to work closely with the university defender to increase the visibility and effectiveness of that position. I am confident that my experience, dedication, and passion for justice will serve the FSU community well in the role of Attorney General. Thank you for your time and consideration.

 Opening Statement:
 - Carson Dale: Hello senators, I got to meet almost all of you last week when I presented to IA, but if you don't know me my name is Carson Dale and I'm honored to be considered for the position of student body deputy treasurer. I've served in senate on the budget committee in the 74th and 75th senate and during this time I've been able to assist in the annual budget week working to allocate \$14.6 million that we had to allocate to different RSOs and budgeting entities around campus. Through budget week, committee meetings, and senate as a whole I've gotten to see firsthand the process of A and S allocation, reviews, and changes all of which have given me insight on the process and what difficulties face leaders who requested them. More than anything I've come to realize that there's a lot of power in the hands of the student government. We have an enormous amount of funding that allows us to let student life on this campus thrive.  Opening Statement:

Taking this semester off how made me realized how much I miss this space, and I truly think my past experience can benefit both the legislative and executive branch in my role as Policy Director. I grew up as a Filipino-American not feeling very connected to my culture, the language, or celebrations, however I can say coming to FSU it felt like none of that mattered, as I found that place that accepted me, despite having that much knowledge. Therefore, I want to become Assistant Director to give back to a community that has given me so much already. I believe this starts with our affiliates, as this is where a lot of our retention comes from in regards to big programming or small day to day conversations. I want to continue to help affiliates through providing resources such as RTAC, PAC, etc, as these are things that can really grow an affiliate. In addition, I hope to educate the public on Asian American topics. AASU has really changed my life, as this is where I got my first intern-ship, became President of one of our affiliates, met the people that led me to the 74th Senate, and met life-long friends. - Vice Chair LoBianco: Reading over your application I saw you wanted to bridge the gap between affiliates and communities on campus. Did you have any specific initiatives in mind to complete this role?
 - Nicole Alvarado: My main goal is to start the initiative of having those conversations with other agencies and affiliates through implementing events or even brain storming ideas. One thing I would like to do is more collaboration with BSU as we both share an affiliate, which I feel is a good representation of those intersecting identities. But yes my main initiative is to begin those conversations to create higher involvement with other agencies in the future
- Chair Salazar: In what ways do you plan on communicating with your Senate Liaison effectively?
 - Nicole Alvarado: I plan on having meet ups with our Liaison to ensure information from both sides is being communicated and to ensure that our Liaison is actually engaged within HLSU. No matter how minor, I want to ensure we are in current contact.
- Chair Salazar: HLSU is one of the largest communities on this campus, how do you plan on running it affectively with cohesiveness amongst affiliates?
 - Nicole Alvarado: I feel this begins with continuing to give back to the community and always keeping the transparency of our agency, as well as providing a safe space to everyone here on campus, as well as continuing to provide resources to the community.
- Chair Salazar: There are two new affiliate organizations within HLSU, how do you plan on creating a smooth transition phase for those affiliates, or do you not see that as your duty?
 - Nicole Alvarado: Of course I would want to incorporate these new affiliates into the HLSU space, while this duty falls more so under the Assistant Director I still plan on being engaged in making sure these affiliates are accounted for and included in our agency. I plan on doing this by communicating with the President of these affiliates to learn what are their needs and how can I help accommodate those needs.
- Chair Salazar: How do you plan on increasing attendance in your President's meetings?
 - Nicole Alvarado: It is very important for high engagement at these meetings, so a way I feel I can increase engagement is by having incentives for affiliates. Affiliates are what help make this union, so it is very important they show. Some of these incentives could include certain awards, hosting of an event, and more.
- Chair Salazar: Do you have any plans for Hispanic Heritage Month?
 - Nicole Alvarado: Currently I have no official plans, but one of my goals is to start working on a theme with my Assistant Director for HHM. One event I plan on continuing is the "We Need to Talk" event, as this has happened for the past 2 years I have been on

E-Board now. For example, last semester we had a "We Need To Talk" discussing language and identity.

- Chair Salazar: Are you familiar with sweepings and how those work?
 - **Nicole Alvarado:** I am aware that sweepings consist of leftover money that can be used for entities on campus.
- Chair Salazar: Do you have any plans for the rest of the year or are you mainly planning on things for the summer and fall?
 - Nicole Alvarado: We don't have any more planning as we have gotten through our mass event which was the Gala. My next focus currently is to prepare interviews for our new Executive Board, and I also plan on beginning to plan for HHM.
- Chair Salazar: On the topic of executive board, how do you plan on picking and managing your executive board?
 - Nicole Alvarado: I plan on working with my Assistant Director to find the people that we are both looking for. Specifically, we want people that have a good work ethic, passion, and experience. Eve if people don't have experience, I am always open to teaching people new skills. I also am looking to having one-on-one's with all of the people on E-Board in order to create a cohesiveness.

 - Opening Statement:
 - Maximo Valdez: Hi everyone, my name is Maximo Valdez, I use he/him pronouns and I have the distinct honor of running for the Assistant Director of the Hispanic Latinx Student Union. As a first generation gay, Cuban American from south Florida, I have always embraced my culture. When I came to FSU, I quickly realized HLSU was my home, and was

reminded to continue to embrace my culture, and that no matter where I am, or who I am around, I will always be Latino. As Assistant Director, it would be my main priority to extend the same atmosphere to other students. HLSU taught me that the many spaces on campus can co-exist peacefully and efficiently. HLSU is not only for Spanish speakers but for anyone looking to learn more about the culture as a whole. With the intersectionality of HLSU, I plan to continue to let this atmosphere thrive by promoting programming that is educational and representative. As the previous Programming Coordinator for the agency, I have had plenty of experience that would qualify me to support our future HLSU E-Board. This is not a position I will take lightly, and I truly don't know where I would be without HLSU. I hope to empower other Latinx students, and I yield the rest of my time.

Round of Questioning:

- Vice Chair LoBianco: What skills from your past positions will help you in this current position?
 - Maximo Valdez: The first position I will definitely leverage is being the Professional Development Coordinator for the Cuban American Student Association. This position taught me a lot about the insides of what It means to be an affiliate organization, thus as I am going to be overseeing affiliates as Assistant Director, already knowing how affiliates work and having that unique perspective will serve me well. I also was the Vice-President of another affiliate, which helped me learned the administrative side of things, which will help me with paperwork and such as Assistant Director.
- Chair Salazar: As Assistant Director, how do you plan to incorporate the two new affiliates into HLSU?
 - Maximo Valdez: I will say I have a unique advantage as I have served as the Vice President of one of these affiliates, which I think will help me introduce the new affiliates to the agency and teach them what it means to be an affiliate It is extremely Important to make them feel welcomed and as important as the older affiliates, and that they will be supported during our President's meetings. - Candidate for Confirmation: [Sean Faletti, Asian American Student Union-Director]
 - Opening Statement:
 - Sean Faletti: Hi my name is Sean Faletti, and for a lot of this year I have been searching the intentionality behind my leadership, and I have found that it has been through my passion for AASU. I want to give back to this community by applying for Director. A little bit about my experience with AASU, as our Outreach Coordinator I have worked with a number of organizations and have seen the interworking's of this agency. I was AASU's Pageant Winner and was a pageant mentor this past year, and also served as AASU's Garnet and Gold Commission Representative. I also worked as the liaison between the Presidential Scholar's Program and the AASU. This past year I also served as the Vice President of SASA, which allowed me to learn the interworking's and structures of how affiliates work. If granted this position, I have three major goals. I first want to do a committee restructuring, particularly for the outreach and social advocacy committees. I have also spoken with Umami's AASU on some future collaborations we could do. I would also like to extend the reach of AASU's solidarity event which is a Ted Talk like event, and possibly even facilitate that as a collaboration with TedXFSU.
 - Round of Questioning:
 - Vice Chair LoBianco: On your application I saw you were applying for originally applying for Education Coordinator, why are you now doing Director?
 - **Sean Faletti:** Yes I originally applied for Education Coordinator but changed my application to Director.
 - Vice Chair LoBianco: What skills from your past position will help you in this current position?
 - Sean Faletti: I think one thing that has helped me a lot was my time spent as the Garnet and Gold Votes Commission representative, which is the first time I truly got to work with various leaders and work on issues such as promoting voting on campus. I was able to see how things happened on the surface and behind the scenes.
 - Chair Salazar: How do you plan on communicating with your Senate Liaison effectively?

- Sean Faletti: Yes so I want to increase the communication between the Executive Branch and the Senate Liaison and let them know when our E-Board meetings are to give them the opportunity if they would like to hear updates or share updates.
- Chair Salazar: How do you plan on running AASU effectively considering it is an extremely large organization?
 - Sean Faletti: To my knowledge previously, the Director is focused on external affairs whereas the Assistant Director was focused on internal affairs, however I feel this may cause miscommunication between the two positions. Thus, I would like to create a blending between the two positions. More so, I would like to go to President's meetings to understand what is going on with our affiliates. I would also like to be involved on the one-on-one's the Assistant Director holds with affiliate Presidents.
- Chair Salazar: How do you plan on picking your E-Board?
 - **Sean Faletti:** In interviews, I will be looking for potential and passion. While I will be looking for talent, I will be additionally looking for motivated individuals who are eager to learn.
- Vice Chair LoBianco: Do you plan on keeping your position as Vice President of SASA and becoming Director of AASU?
 - Sean Faletti: I am actually the President elect for SASA now, so something I would want to clarify is that we will be expanding our board for SASA, which will add an internal and external vice president. I will also be creating new positions such as fundraising and chairs such as that. Thus, I have full confidence in managing my time in both leadership opportunities.
