 - He responded that he came up with the amount given and he did speak with the closet. They said they were more than happy that this bill was being sponsored considering what is going on with COVID.

- **Resolution 45:**
 - Sponsor: Mark Porter
 - He discussed the honor lock partnership with FSU. Most students are not happy, there seems to be privacy issues, the application monitors your network which could be bad for students that live in apartments and share connection with



other computer users, could easily flag for academic honesty, and there's privacy issues when honor lock scans the room.

- Honor lock rubs students the wrong way. There was no student input in the decision to implement this program and it's an invasion of privacy.
 - Yield time was 6:44
 - There was no Technical Non-Debatable Questions, so Senator Tillman moved to go into roundtable which Senator Lowry seconded.
 - Senator Selva stated her concern of honor lock. Honor lock has a website about privacy and concern/does not violate student privacy. We should support FSU. This bill takes away from the efforts FSU has been doing. She has not felt violated from the bill
 - Senator Lowry stated that she has not had personal issues with it, however, her peers have had issues with it because of the honor lock scanning the room violating privacy. She feels as if it has gone overboard.

 - Senator Tillman stated that his girlfriend has been taking classes over the summer that requires honorlock. There's not going to be any sure way to protect student dishonesty because you leave a webpage unattended for a while and it flags for you for cheating. Tillman said that we need to look into better alternatives.

 - Senator Lowry stated that if you look down to long or move your head you get flagged for cheating. I shouldn't be flagged for cheating for making a motion.

 - Senator Giplao said that it's important what has been cited in the poll. 95% of students said they dislike it which is important to consider. As senators, we need to do something about this. There was no consultation with any branches of SGA before FSU initiated this policy. Our opinions as representatives were not represented in this decision.

 - Senator Selva stated that without honor lock, students would take advantage of it and then posed the question what could you put in place of honor lock?

 - Senator Porter stated that he's had classes online that had no programs like this put in place. We're adults and there should be a sense of trust for us not to cheat. We need to talk to FSU reps to see what other options there could be

 - Closing statement: this is an important conversation that needs to be had even if there's no concrete decision on it. We need to let people understand that fsu students are unhappy and we need to do something about it.
