All candidates passed committee and have the full support of the committee, and will be heard tonight in Senate.

Senate Confirmations: Taylor Deering, Homecoming Overall Director; Breeana LaQuea, Homecoming Overall Assistant Director; Jimmy Cannon, Homecoming Live Director

- Opening Statements:
 - Taylor Deering: Junior majoring in Human Resource Management and Marketing. 3rd year as a part of Homecoming at FSU. Got involved as a Spirit Force member in 2018, transitioned into the Creative Chair role, and currently serves as the Operations Director. Being Overall Director has been a goal of her ever since serving on Spirit Force.
 - Breeana LaQuea: Junior majoring in Media Communication Studies and Interdisciplinary Social Sciences. Also got involved in Homecoming with Spirit Force in 2018. Served as Outreach Chair in 2019, working with RSOs and campus agencies. Currently serves as Hospitality Chair. It has always been her goal to be Assistant Overall Director. Loves collaborating with a team on leadership.
 - Jimmy Cannon: Also joined Homecoming in 2018 through Spirit Force. Served as Sponsorship Chair for Homecoming in 2019, coordinating with local businesses trying to get sponsorships, trying to increase budget and make the most of the budget. Currently serves as the Director of Parade and Chief & Princess, and also works with the Student Alumni Association. Loves Homecoming very much.
- Questions:
 - A Gonzalez: have the candidates been to applicable trainings, such as NCBI, Allies & Safe Zones, or Green Dot?
 - Taylor: went to Green Dot. In 2019, all of the Homecoming Council was required to do Green Dot training. We also have a leadership meeting before being put into our roles on inclusive leadership, teamwork, and communication. We are very inclusive and work hard to be well-rounded leaders.
 - Breeana: Agrees with Taylor. Completed Green Dot in 2019 with the council. Goal of the Homecoming Council to get more certifications to be the most inclusive organization that we can be.

- Jimmy: Went through Green Dot training with Homecoming, has been through NCBI training, and received certificate for the Diversity & Inclusion Institute for the Center for Leadership and Social Change. Wants to continue representation; looking to bring a queer comedian of color to FSU.
- Soto: what influenced you to apply for these positions?
 - Taylor: Has been a goal since joining Homecoming. Being in the roles she has been in, she has been able to get a holistic view of the Homecoming events. Especially in the Operations Director role, working with the logistics of the events and learning about each one best fits the position she is running for now. It is an opportunity to continue learning and working with the 30 other students on Homecoming Council. Looks forward to hearing their ideas and helping them grow as student leaders.
 - Breeana: Has always been a goal of hers to be Overall Assistant Director. Previous roles allowed her to step into a supporting role for directors, and this is something she wants to continue with Taylor on this leadership team. Those who held the Overall Assistant Director position in the past always helped her in the positions she has held; this role works internally in communications, outreach, and hospitality. This is where her strongest abilities are.
 - Jimmy: Homecoming Live is not something that he initially applied for, but he has a lot of programming experience with this year's parade and Homecoming Court. Very good at sticking to a deadline. Excited for the ideas that he has and looking forward to building a council.
- Randall: 2 of the candidates are from Randall's College, the College of Communication & Information, so shoutout to that. Homecoming has been affected and will likely continue to be affected by the COVID-19 pandemic and the recent health and safety regulations. Given what you have learned from this past year in your current role, how are you going to take the knowledge you've gained and apply it to your new role, and give an example?
 - Taylor: Has dealt with logistics and COVID-19 restrictions in the past year. Homecoming is next week, April 5th-10th. We are planning to have people stationed at check-in for events to monitor swipe-in, enforce capacity, and that people have completed the Daily Wellness Check. Most events will be outside to give the opportunity for social distancing. Will place signs around the events to remind people to complete the Daily Wellness Check and swipe in to the event. Has already purchased hand sanitizer and masks. These are things that we will potentially take into next year. It's important to be flexible. These steps are necessary to ensure the safety of the Homecoming Council and all participants.
 - Breeana: Just earlier today was packing things to be handed out at Homecoming events, making sure to minimize contact and that everything is prepackaged. Also that everyone understands the check-in requirements, and ensuring accessibility through Zoom.
 - Jimmy: The pandemic allowed Homecoming to increase accessibility and inclusivity. We always want more people to participate, so some good has come of these changes. Instead of trying to grow vertically and getting more people to attend, we have expanded horizontally to create the most possibilities for people to attend. If you do not know what this year's Homecoming Parade will look like, follow @fsusaa and @fsuhomecoming if you are curious. Was his idea to do the reverse parade format, which will feature stationary floats in the Civic Center parking lot that people can drive by in their cars. We were concerned about having large groups of spectators, potentially not wearing masks, so we require everyone to stay in their cars. I also want to keep Homecoming Live in Doak Campbell Stadium because compared to the Civic Center, it is less expensive, has higher capacity, is more accessible, and is outdoors.
- A. Gonzalez, with reservation for follow-up: How would you describe your character, and how does your character play into conflict resolution?

- Taylor: very communicative, gives everyone the opportunity to make sure their voices are heard, recognizes that everyone who will be on Homecoming has great ideas to share. Always willing to hear both sides of a conflict and work to resolve it, whether that means speaking to both sides or providing resources for them to individually work towards a solution. Transparency is also important.
 - Breeana: also a communicative leader. Focuses on her interpersonal relationships and her accessibility as a leader to establish trust, so that when a conflict arises they are able to come to her directly.
 - Jimmy: Agrees that communication is key to solving conflict, most problems can be solved by getting people together and talking about the root of the issue. Believes in the power that Homecoming has to bring people together.
 - A. Gonzalez (follow-up): Homecoming was given \$310,000 in 2019, their budget was cut to \$280,000 in 2020, and has been cut again to \$250,000 in 2021. How do you plan on adjusting programming to take into account these budget cuts?
 - Taylor: Homecoming has taken a significant decrease in budget over the last few years. In the past Homecoming had a concert, but no longer doing that. Making sure that the budget was get is distributed equitably across the programs provided. Working with campus partners to cut costs, also decreased spending in communications because the pandemic allowed the expansion of our virtual advertisement.
 - Breeana: campus partners have helped greatly to cut costs; Club Downunder was able to provide a karaoke machine for Karaoke for a Cause, which saved Homecoming the cost of renting a karaoke machine from somewhere else. Has been able to secure a monetary sponsorship this year, and looking forward to continuing to form these relationships.
 - Jimmy: Breeana is being modest in talking about the hospitality and sponsorship team; they are incredible. They have been raising money and this is something we want to continue to foster because we value community relationships. Moving Homecoming Live from the Civic Center to Doak Campbell Stadium will also save us money. For context, bringing Pete Davidson to FSU was \$70,000, and production alone can easily cost \$100,000. It's very important who we bring here for Homecoming Live.
- **Randall moves to forward the candidates individually, A. Gonzalez seconds; no objections**
- Closing Statements:
 - Taylor: Thank you for listening to our ideas, this team is great. Excited to potentially work with the other candidates. This is going to be a quick turnaround; typically Homecoming is in the Fall so this is an unprecedented Homecoming. Excited to have this Homecoming and take this leadership into Fall 2021 as well.
 - Breeana: Thank you, this is a quick turnaround so thank you for allowing us to be heard tonight, we are grateful for this relationship with SGA. Looking forward to getting to work right away, and to seeing you all at Homecoming April 5th-10th!
 - Jimmy: Thank you for your time and energy, thank you for your questions as they have made me think more about what I want Homecoming Live to look like for the student body.

Resolution 31 Sponsored Senator Lessard (P), Marcus, Soto (Co)
Adding an administrative leave of absence to Rule 13 as an option for suspended Senators
REFERRED TO RULES & CALENDAR, 03.17. TABLED IN RULES & CALENDAR, 03.24. PASSED IN RULES & CALENDAR 3.31.

- Opening Statement:
 - Lessard: Administrative leave of absences, as it currently stands, cannot be given freely. In a lot of cases, impeachment is too harsh. Senators may be too busy or dealing with their mental health. This legislation allows Rules to place a Senator on an administrative leave of absence, versus the Senator requesting it themselves.
 - Marcus: Had to witness the sad reality of a suspension hearing at Rules & Calendar committee. This option of leave of absence seems to take out some of the negative emotions of the suspension hearing. We are people first, and this resolution affirms that we are people first, students second, and senators third.
- Technical Non-Debatable Questions:

- A. Gonzalez: why does the legislation only require a simple majority vote, rather than a two-thirds vote?
 - Lessard: it seemed the easiest, just in case committee members are absent. Not opposed to amending to change that.
- **Randall moves to amend Resolution 31 with the amendment sent to Pro Tempore Wang; Little seconds; no objections**
 - **Sponsors find it friendly; amendment accepted**
- Pro:
 - England: in favor of this legislation; seems weird that they have to come to Rules to request leave of absence, gives the committee a necessary alternative because impeachment is harsh in many cases. As it stands, the only options for hearing suspended Senators are to remove their suspension or forward them to impeachment. Neither of these options made sense in the recent scenarios. Yields in strong favor.
- **A. Gonzalez moves to amend Resolution 31 to strike out “a simple majority vote” and replace with “a two-thirds vote”, England seconds**
 - **Randall objects**
 - Debate:
 - Opening Statement:
 - A. Gonzalez: Put forth this amendment because one of the Senators having a suspension hearing did not want a leave of absence. This Senator said he was committed to attending, and the Chairs did not want to give him a leave of absence. The feelings of all the Chairs should be taken into account, and raising the threshold to ensure that two-thirds majority is in agreement is important. This ensures that the committee does not force anyone out of the Senate who does not want a leave of absence, especially since most Senators win their seats in an election.
 - Technical Non-Debatable Questions:
 - N/A
 - Pro:
 - England: agrees because placing someone on leave, potentially against their wishes, is serious. There are 7 voting members of the committee; a simple majority would require 4 votes, while a two-thirds vote would require 5, so this amendment only requires 1 additional vote. Will be supporting this.
 - Marcus: The sponsors both find the amendment friendly. Suspensions are usually for a reason, and this two-thirds threshold will ensure that it is being used for the proper reasons.
 - Lessard: in favor of the amendment. Removing Senators from the Senate is a big deal and it should not be taken lightly. Senators often do not want to go on leave, so care should be taken in making this decision. Furthermore, one extra vote being required is not a huge deal in the grand scheme of things.
 - Randall: **POPI**, can I withdraw my objection?
 - Parliamentarian Rowan: Yes, can withdraw at any time
 - **Randall withdraws objection; Sponsors find the amendment friendly**

Resolution 32

Sponsored Senator Randall (P)

Amending Rule Thirteen and Fourteen to clarify expectations regarding financial certifications and suspension.

REFERRED TO RULES & CALENDAR, 03.24. PASSED IN RULES & CALENDAR, 03.31.

- Opening Statement:
 - Randall: encountered issues with clarity regarding financial suspensions. This legislation takes the 15-school-day requirement, which is already in statutes, and extends it and puts in place a suspension procedure. That's the second part; the first part (13.6) takes some things that were lumped together to break them down. States what the Rules committee can do if they do not want to forward a Senator for impeachment: unsuspend the Senator, or place them on leave of absence. Clarifies and reference the new addition just passed tonight by Senator Lessard. Rules 14.6 and 14.7 are the biggest changes; institutes the same restrictions for Senators' leave of absence onto Senators who do not achieve financial certification.
- Technical Non-Debatable Questions:
 - A. Gonzalez: Rule 14.7.1.a discusses taking office. Is there any specification regarding the fiscal year change and needing to take the financial certification exam?
 - Randall: That would have to be changed in Statutes. This only talks about how we deal with financial certifications. I would not address Senators that need to be newly financially certified in this resolution. Would love to work with Senator A. Gonzalez to correct this in Statutes.
 - A. Gonzalez: So this resolution is only talking about if someone wins their office and has not taken the financial certification exam, but does not address sitting Senators that needs to retake the exam in the new fiscal year?
 - Randall: correct
- Randall: **POC**, the question that Senator A. Gonzalez asked is in a Bill already submitted. If you have comments on that, go to Judiciary

Resolution 33

Sponsored Senator Soto (P)

Condemning legislation harmful to transgender and non-binary students of all ages, calls OGA to stand in opposition during session, and suggests inclusivity training for state legislators.

REFERRED TO SLAA THEN RULES & CALENDAR, 03.24. PASSED IN SLAA, 03.30. PASSED IN RULES & CALENDAR, 3.31.

- Opening Statement:
 - Soto: Harmful legislation is currently making its way through the Florida House and Senate. This resolution describes the 2 Bills that it refers to: HB 1475 and SB 2012. This resolution explains why these bills are harmful and quotes articles. Condemns the actions of the legislators that sponsor these bills, and specifically states that OGA should add it to their legislative agenda, as it affects FSU students. Amended in committee to correct the labelling of people.
- Technical Non-Debatable Questions:
 - Marcus: Can you confirm that there was a hearing in the Florida Senate on Transgender Visibility Day?
 - Soto: yes unfortunately, SB 2012 was heard today and passed in committee.
 - A. Gonzalez: So this resolution is only talking about if someone wins their office and has not taken the financial certification exam, but does not address sitting Senators that needs to retake the exam in the new fiscal year?
 - Randall: correct
- Pro:
 - Lessard: as a member of the LGBTQIA+ community myself, this Resolution is important, we really need to condemn what is going on at the state level right now. In full support of this and hopes to see the rest of the Senate agree
 - A. Gonzalez: In full support, especially likes the addition of calling upon OGA
 - Marcus: we must acknowledge that similar legislation is popping up in state legislatures across the country. Unfortunately, Marcus' home state has passed a very similar bill. The people that this hurts already go through trauma; society already forces stigmas onto these people. Both the NCAA and Florida High School Athletic Association already have regulations regarding this topic. Furthermore, nobody goes through the trauma of gender dysphoria for the supposed advantage in a sports match.
 - Lessard: uses the remaining time to extinguish the first round of pro
