Good evening everybody, I just wanted to echo but congratulations to all you Chairs and Vice Chairs, it is very well deserved. Thank you to everyone who came to the New Senator Orientation, I know it was kind of long, so I appreciate you hanging in there. Last thing I have for you all is something really exciting. So returning members, you have heard me talk about this a little, but we recently signed two contracts with Civic+ and MuniCode. MuniCode is a company based in Tallahassee in the 1950's by a guy named George Langford. This will help put FSU SGA in a good spot to share best practices for student affairs. We are the 2nd University SGA in the entire country to use MuniCode. So here is OU's SGA MuniCode. We are going to take the statutes, the senate rules of procedures, COGS rules of procedures, bylaws for boards, and upload them all to MuniCode. So rather than keeping them in a PDF or word to upload to the website, we are going to be able to directly upload any updates to MuniCode right away. This will also allow you to get directly to all of the bills and resolutions are that have been passed. We can also generate bills and other legislations directly out of MuniCode. In terms of timing, this is the easier one of the two, so

before winter break I want to make final updates on the constitutions, and all other documents updated, and feed them over to the MuniCode, and over break they will format them as shown. The other one is called Civic+, for their agenda and meeting minutes. Our target is to have it rolled out for Summer Senate. Once we get towards implementation there will be training sessions. The cool thing about it is, if you are the person taking the minutes, you'll be able to go in and timestamp minutes. It will tie it up with the video we are doing for it. Each person will have their own log in, and enter notes on any of the calender updates. So here's an example from Lake County. This shows the towns commission, so if you want to find a meeting, it will show you the agenda packets and the minutes right away, after they have been approved. We will do video links and have them saved in Civic+, that will not expire. You'll be able to go to a drop down to just look at filter items you want to view, such as different boards, and minutes. Over the summer we will test it out, fix it up, so that by fall we will be ready to go. Through these apps, you can edit and upload every document that goes up to the websites, instead of going through Ben Young. I am so excited, and this is going to speed up all these processes. Anyhow, you can tell I am pretty excited. My plan is to have all the old bills, all the way back to the 1st Student Senate, uploaded to these apps. I also want to make it searchable eventually. Any questions? Proud of you all!
