Bills First Reading:

Bill 60	Sponsored by Senator Diaz (P) Amending the nomenclature of the Rules and Student Life committees in Statutes to align with the current Senate Rules of Procedure and the current practices of the Student Senate. (Referred to Judiciary. Tabled in Judiciary 07.14)
Bill 64	Sponsored by Senator Rowan (P) Kariher (Co) A Bill to Enact a Standard Term Length to Ensure Accountability. (Referred to Judiciary and Rules & Calendar. Amended and Passed in Judiciary 07.14. Failed in Rules & Calendar 07.15)
Bill 65	Sponsored by Senator Rowan (P) Kariher (Co) A Bill to Abolish the Mental Health Council, as it does not provide tangible outcomes for the Student Body, and allowing the Executive Branch to set

up Cabinet committees dedicated to a particular area of advocacy. **(Referred to Internal Affairs, Judiciary, and Budget. Passed in Internal Affairs 07.12. Passed in Judiciary 07.14. Failed in Budget 07.14)**

Bill 66 Sponsored by Senator Rowan (P) Kariher (Co)
A Bill To Abolish the Student Council for Accessibility Advocacy, as it does not provide tangible outcomes for the Student Body. **(Referred to Internal Affairs, Judiciary, and Budget. Passed in Internal Affairs 07.12. Passed in Judiciary 07.14. Failed in Budget 07.14)**

Bill 70 Sponsored by Senator Folwell (P)
This bill addresses several issues in Chapter 302, regarding the Class Councils. Among these issues includes references to incorrect statutes, general legislative vagueness, conflation of an “officer” of the Class Councils and a “member-at-large” of the Class Councils, the application process timeline not adequately reflecting how applications have been handled, forcing a President of a Class Council wishing to resign to hand in a resignation to themselves, and general typos. **(Referred to Student Life and Judiciary. Passed in Student Life 07.13. Failed in Judiciary 07.14)**

Bills Second Reading:

Bill 58 Sponsored by Senator Folwell (P) Diaz (Co)
Pursuant to Statute 807.6(B), this bill reflects a request to fund a Registered Student Organization out of Senate Projects due to PAC’s inability to meet during the summer semesters. This transfer is to fund t-shirts for NAACP so they can further promote their organization to the Student Body and to advance their mission of active voter engagement and registration ahead of important midterm elections this year. **(Referred to Student Life and Budget 6.22. Passed in Student Life 6.29. Passed in Budget 6.30. Tabled on the Floor 07.06)**

Bill 59 Sponsored by Senator Folwell (P) Diaz (Co)
This bill consolidates the various statements about Senators taking Leaves of Absence, simplifies and codifies the process, and makes it so that senators on a leave of absence are not counted toward quorum. **(Referred to Judiciary and Rules & Calendar 6.22. Amended and Passed in Judiciary 7.05. Passed in Rules & Calendar 7.06. Tabled on the Floor 07.06)**

Bill 61 Sponsored by Senator Marting (P) Diaz (Co)
Pursuant to Statutes 418.4(B) and 807.6(B)(2), this bill represents the funds to be reimbursed into Senate Projects from PAC following allocations made through Bill 58 of the summer term of the 74th Student Senate. **(Referred to Budget. Passed in Budget 07.14)**

Bill 62 Sponsored by Senator Kariher (P) Diaz (Co)

Pursuant to Statute 807.6(B), this bill reflects a request to fund a Registered Student Organization out of Senate Projects due to RTAC's inability to meet during the summer semesters. This transfer is to fund the Horn Studio of FSU's travel to the International Horn Symposium in Kingsville, Texas. RSO members will perform at the symposium and have the opportunity to network with prominent musicians from around the world. **(Referred to Student Life and Budget. Passed in Student Life 07.13. Passed in Budget 07.14)**

Bill 63 Sponsored by Senator Marting (P) Diaz (Co)
Pursuant to Statutes 418.4(B) and 807.6(B)(2), this bill represents the funds to be reimbursed into Senate Projects from RTAC following allocations made through Bill 62 of the summer term of the 74th Student Senate. **(Referred to Budget. Passed in Budget 07.14)**

Bill 67 Sponsored by Senator Rowan (P) Kariher (Co)
A Bill to Establish Regulations on the Formation and Operation of Bureaus in Order to Ensure Tangible Outcomes by Student Government Bureaus. **(Referred to Internal Affairs, Judiciary, and Rules & Calendar. Passed in Internal Affairs 07.12. Passed in Judiciary 07.14. Passed in Rules & Calendar 07.15)**

Bill 68 Sponsored by Senator Rowan (P) Kariher (Co)
A Bill to Codify that Resolutions Amending the Senate's Rules of Procedure Shall be Binding and Have Immediate Effect. **(Referred to Judiciary and Rules & Calendar. Amended and Passed in Judiciary 07.14. Passed in Rules & Calendar 07.15)**

Bill 69 Sponsored by Senator Rivers (P)
To make it so, the incoming Senior Class is the voting body for the incoming Senior Class Council. **(Referred to Student Life and Judiciary. Passed in Student Life 07.13. Passed in Judiciary 07.14)**

CA 3 Sponsored by Senator Diaz (P) Drackley, Folwell, Tucker (Co)
Lowering the Constitutional threshold to fill vacated non-elected offices in the Student Government from a 2/3 to majority vote of the Student Senate.
