Petitioner raises a complaint that Respondent, Riley Perantoni, violated SBS 710.6(f)(2) by grabbing a member of the Student Body's phone and attempting to vote for her. After reviewing the evidence submitted, I do believe that petitioner has carried their burden to prove the violation by clear and convincing evidence SBS §710.4 (g).

SBS §710.6(F)(3): Any attempt to perpetrate a fraudulent election. This shall include, but is not limited to, providing false information regarding filing or elections procedures, voting more than once, or attempting to vote with another person's student identification (FSU ID)

The petitioner displays in evidence the screen of a member of the Student Body's phone and it shows the ballot. The phone's screen does not indicate the page before the login as it lacks red, but the picture while blurry can be identified using the voting confirmation page or the ballot itself. Regardless of which screen the member of the public had, it is clear that the candidate has taken hold of the Student Body members phone in the picture.

Based on the information reviewed, the alleged violation is filed under SBS §710.6(F)(3).

If you do not agree with the decision, it is within your right to appeal to the Electoral Commission to have it reviewed up to the Supreme Court. All students will have the option to present their case directly to the elections commission, choose a third-party to represent them, or be appointed a law student by the Supreme Court to represent their case before the Elections Commission.
