Q5. Please present any arguments for this alleged violation along with any relevant evidence.

On October 13, 2025, at approximately 10:33 AM, Riley Perantoni, an Independent candidate for the College of Criminology and Criminal Justice, Seat 1, was observed holding the phone of a voter outside of Diffenbaugh Building. While the mere act of holding a voter's phone is improper during an election period, it is not a violation. Further review of the attached photographic evidence shows that the voter's phone was open to the official FSU SGA voting webpage at the time of the incident. The distinctive red border displayed at the top and bottom of the screen matches that of the official SGA voting interface, confirming the voter was in the process of casting or could cast their ballot. By taking physical possession of a voter's device while the SGA voting platform was active, the respondent gained the ability to view and potentially interact with the voting page, thereby engaging in conduct that constitutes the "use to cast votes for another person" as prohibited under §710.6(f)(2). Such behavior directly undermines the integrity of the election process and meets the statutory definition of a fraudulent vote under Chapter 710.6(f)(2).
