The conduct at issue constitutes a clear violation of § 710.6(d)(4), Student Body Statutes. The operative language of the statute establishes a bright-line rule: no candidate shall engage in campaigning prior to one (1) week before the election. For the Fall 2025 General Election, the designated campaign period commenced on October 6,

2025, at 12:00 A.M.

The Respondent, however, engaged in actions that meet the definition of campaigning prior to this date. Specifically, the Respondent's friend posted on their Instagram account a message stating, "Vote Emma Grimes for Undergraduate Seat 1," directly promoting the Respondent's candidacy before the authorized campaign period. Moreover, the individual who made the post was listed on the Respondent's affiliation form as a volunteer, thereby connecting the campaign-related conduct to the Respondent's campaign team.

This activity cannot be reasonably characterized as independent or unrelated third-party expression. Rather, it constitutes campaign activity intended to solicit support and influence the electorate, which is expressly prohibited under § 710.6(d)(4).

By disregarding the statutory campaign time restrictions, the Respondent gained an unfair electoral advantage over other candidates who adhered to the law. Accordingly, this conduct constitutes a Schedule 2 violation under the Election Code and warrants appropriate sanction.
