- The mission of Renegade Boxing is to spread the sport of boxing to a group of a traditionally underrepresented group in the sport (those pursuing higher education), while teaching self-defense. Those whose skills are shown have the ability to represent Renegade Boxing and Florida State as a whole at the United States Intercollegiate Boxing Association (USIBA) national tournament over spring break. This year, the team is traveling to Atlanta to compete at the 10th anniversary of USIBA being hosted by Georgia Tech
- This trip will benefit the FSU student body by financially supporting 2 coaches (both current undergraduate students, one man, one woman) and 8 fighters (7 men, one woman) competing in their respective brackets. We could have FSU's first team title as previous year's we were only able to send in a small team with our best being 5 in 2018 (At Illinois), where we placed 3rd overall). This also is likely the year we have the most individual titles as well as the coaching championship as well. It'd be a great opportunity to show the FSU student body about a club not too many know about as well as helping out some students who have already spent a lot of their own money towards USA Boxing passbooks, USA boxing physicals, and USIBA registration (\$130-200 of our own). This could also allow us to get more local business support so the next year we do this, we wouldn't need RTAC money. Our current president's freshman year he spent \$800 of his own to compete and win to represent the University at Syracuse. We are just trying to get hotel room coverage.

Individually we are all driving up and back on our own and handled our own registrations for the tournament itself
